Individual Narrative of Jesse⁷ Leverich Jr [128] Son of Jesse⁶ Leverich [57]

Jesse Leverich Jr^{1,2,3} was born on 22 Dec 1795 at Newtown, Queens Co, New York, the son of Jesse Leverich and Gashe Berrian. He was probably baptized at the Newtown Presbyterian Church, like his siblings, but there are no baptism records for the Church in the year 1796.^{4,5,6}

Jesse married Maria Ann Bailey on 10 Feb 1821 at Newtown, Queens County, New York.^{7,8} Neither a birth date nor the identity of her parents have been determined for Mary Ann Bailey. Assuming that she was a least 16 years old when she married Jesse, Mary Ann would have been born before 1805. "Mrs. Leverich, wife of Jesse Leverich Jr" died at Newtown 16 September 1822. She was probably buried at the Newtown Presbyterian Church.^{9,10,11}

Jesse Leverich is listed in the 1823 New York City Directory, a coach maker at 452 Broadway, living at 107 Spring Street.¹²

Jesse Leverich is listed in the 1830 and 1831 New York City Directories as a coach maker 217 Wooster St, which was located at the corner of West Houston St.^{13,14}

The 1830 U.S. Census of Manhattan, New York County, New York lists in Ward 9 what appears to be a Jesse Leveridge. The census taker's handwriting is difficult to decipher. Although there is a census tally for 1 free white male age 30 to 39 that fits Jesse Leverich Jr, there are additional census tallies for what appears to be a wife and four children, which does not fit the profile of Jesse Leverich Jr. at that time. In addition, the 1830 New York City Directory address location was in Ward 7, not Ward 9. No other records of a Jesse Leverich are found in the 1830 U.S. Census.¹⁵

Jesse Leverich is listed in the 1833 New York City Directory, coach maker at 5 Bedford St.¹⁶ No listing for Jesse Leverich is found in the New York City Directory, 1832, and 1834 to 1836.^{17,18,19,20}

Jesse Leverich Jr. married for a second time Mary [Unidentified] circa 1836 at Manhattan, New York Co, New York. The marriage date is an estimate based upon the birth year (1838) of the first child of Mary and Jesse Leverich. Mary was born about 1813 in New York State, as per the Federal and State Census records 1850 to 1880. Mary's surname and the names of her parents have not been identified.^{21,22,23,24,25,26,27}

Jesse Leverich is not listed in the New York City Directories 1837 to 1840.^{28,29,30,31} Jesse Leverich Jr. is not found in the 1840 U.S. Census in New York or New Jersey.^{32,33}

The estate of Cornelia Leverich, widow of William⁶ Leverich Sr. [59], was proved at the Queens County, New York Surrogate 20 February 1841, as part of the final settlement of the estate of her late husband. In the list of heirs of the estate, it is noted that Jesse Leverich Jr sold his interest in the estate to his brother William⁷ Leverich 3rd [123].³⁴

Jesse Leverich is not listed in the New York City Directories 1841 to 1844.^{35,36,37,38} Jesse Leverich is listed in the 1845 New York City Directory, a coach maker at 158 West 20th Street, and the 1850 New York City Directory, a carriage maker at West 26th Street near 7th Avenue.^{39,40}

Jesse Leverich Jr. is not listed in city directories or the census for an eleven year period from 1834 to 1844. However, census records suggest that Jesse married for a second time c 1836, and had daughters born c 1838 and c 1843 in New York State.^{41,42}

Jesse Leverich, age 58, coach maker, is recorded as a head of family in the 1850 U.S. Census of Manhattan, Ward 16, New York County, New York. The household also includes wife Mary, age 36; children Eliza (aka Elvira, Elmira), age 13; Amanda, age 7; and Jesse (aka William Jesse), age 6; all household members were born in New York.⁴³

Jesse Leverich, age 58 (same as 1850 census record), "builder", is listed in the 1855 New York State Census as the head of household, Manhattan, Ward 20, Enumeration District 6, New York Co, New York. The household also includes wife Mary, age 43; children Elvira, age 17; Amanda, age 12; and Jesse age 7. The census records indicate that Jesse was born in Suffolk County, which would appear to be an error; Mary was born in Queens County and the three children were all born in New York County.44

Jesse Leverich is listed in the New York City Directories 1855 to 1858, as follows:

Jesse Leverich is not listed in the New York City Directory in 1859 and 1860. During this period, Jesse and his family relocated to Brooklyn, Kings Co, New York.^{50,51}

Jesse Leverich, age 61, carriage maker, is recorded as a head of family in the 1860 U.S. Census of Brooklyn, Ward 17, Kings County, New York. The household also includes wife E. Mary, age 40; children Eleanor (aka Elvira, Elmira), age 20; Amanda, age 17; and William (aka William Jesse) age 12. All household members were born in New York.⁵²

Jesse Leverich Jr. died on 14 Mar 1861 at Brooklyn, Kings, New York, at age 65. Jesse was buried at the Newtown Presbyterian Church in Queens County, New York. 53,54

The 1862 Brooklyn City Directory lists a Mary Leverich, widow, living at Meserole Avenue near Oakland Street, in the Eastern District (aka Greenpoint), Ward 17, consistent with the 1860 census record.⁵⁵

Mary Leverich, age 52, a widow, is listed as a head of household in the 1865 New York State Census, Ward 15 Brooklyn, Kings Co, New York. The household also includes Elvira Leverich age 27 and William Leverich age 17. All household members are born in New York State, Mary in Rockland County, Elvira and William in New York County. The Rockland County birth place for Mary is inconsistent with the Queens County birthplace in the 1855 New York State Census. The census also records that Mary had three children and had been married two times. This implies that Mary's marriage to Jesse Leverich was her second marriage, although no further information in this regard has been found. Daughter Amanda is not found in the 1865 Census. She presumably had not married, since she is listed as Amanda Leverich in the 1870 U.S. Census.56,57

Mary Leverich, widow, is listed in the 1869 Brooklyn City Directory at 50 1/2 South 6th Street in Williamsburgh, the Eastern District. Mary is listed in the 1870 Brooklyn City Directory at Spencer St near Myrtle Avenue, which was located in Ward 8. At the same address, there is a listing for William Leverich, salesman. 58,59

Mary Leverich, age 57, is listed as a head of household in the 1870 U.S. Census, Brooklyn Ward 21, Kings Co, New York, Mary owned no real estate, and her personal estate was valued at \$200 (\$3,800 in 2016 dollars). Her occupation is listed as "keeping house". The household also included Elmira Beckwith (perhaps Becksmith), age 32, teaching school; ⁶⁰ Since Amanda Leverich, age 27, seamstress: and William Leverich, age 22, clerk in store, married within the year.⁶⁰ William's wife is not listed in the household, it is reasonable to assume that the couple were engaged to be married.

"Beckwith" implies that Elmira (aka Elvira) had married since the 1865 census, but was then in 1870, widowed, separated, or divorced, since no husband is listed in the household. However, the origin of the "Beckwith" surname in 1870 remains a puzzle, since "Elvira" uses the surname Leverich in the 1875 New York State census. 61,62,63

Mary Leverich, widow, is listed in the 1874 Brooklyn City Directory living at 82 Kosciusko Street.⁶⁴

"Susan E." Leverich, a widow and vest maker, age 60, born Rockland Co, New York is listed as head of household in the 1875 New York State Census, Brooklyn, Ward 21. Also included in the household is daughter Elvira Leverich, single, age 30, vest maker, born in New York County. The given name of Susan E., rather than Mary, would appear to be a recording error by the census taker. The age recorded for "Elvira" is closer to the age recorded in previous censuses for her sister Amanda. However, no "Elvira Beckwith" nor an Amanda Leverich of pertinent age as per the 1870 U.S. census is found in the 1875 State census.65

Mary Leverich, age 68, a widow, is recorded as a head of household in the 1880 U.S. Census of Brooklyn, Ward 21, Kings Co, New York living on Monroe Street. Also included in the household is daughter Amanda Leverich, age 35, "at home". No Elvira (or Elmira) Leverich or Beckwith is found in the 1880 census. Son William Leverich is found living in Bergen County, New Jersey in the 1880 census.^{66,67} Mary Leverich is listed in the 1881 Brooklyn City Directory, widow of Jesse, living at 456A Monroe Street, consistent with the 1880 U.S. Census.⁶⁸

Mary Leverich, widow, is listed in the 1891 Brooklyn City Directory living at rear of 78 Sandford Street.⁶⁹ Neither Mary Leverich, widow, nor any of her children, are found in the 1892 New York State Census in Kings County.⁷⁰

The 1894 Brooklyn City Directory lists Amanda Leverich, "agency", living at 790 Gates Avenue. It is possible that Amanda's mother Mary, then age 81, was living with her, although there is no separate directory listing for Mary.⁷¹

Mary Leverich, widow of Jesse Leverich Jr., died 11 March 1897 at Brooklyn, Kings Co, New York, as per her death certificate. Neither a death notice nor a place of burial for Mary has been determined.^{72,73}

Jesse Leverich Jr and his second wife Mary (surname unidentified) had three children.^{74,75,76,77}

- ^{i.} Elvira (aka Elmira, Eliza, Eleanor) was born about 1838 in Manhattan, New York County, New York. Elvira may have been married to a "Beckwith" (perhaps Becksmith) but the evidence is unclear. Elvira died some time after 1875. Neither an exact date of death nor a place of burial has been determined. Elvira is recorded in census records for 1850, 1855, 1860, 1865, 1870, and 1875.
- ii. Amanda Leverich was born about 1843 in Manhattan, New York County, New York. Amanda was never married, at least as of 1894. Amanda died sometime after 1894 when she is listed in the Brooklyn City Directory. Amanda is recorded in census records for 1850, 1855, 1860, 1870, and 1880. A 1900 U.S. Census record in Yorktown, Westchester Co, New York lists a Leverich without a first name provided, female, age 57, born February 1843, a servant in the household of Jeremiah and Phebe J. Townsend. This is consistent with the 1843 birth period for Amanda in earlier census records. This record is distinct from the record for an Amanda Leverich in Cortlandt, Westchester Co.^{84,85,86,87,88,89,90}
- iii. William Jesse Leverich was born about November 1848 in Manhattan, New York County, New York. William married Maria Amelia McCouch about 1869. The exact date and place of the marriage has not been determined. Maria's identity is listed in the death certificate of her daughter Jessie Emily Grant, who died in 1947 in Staunton, Virginia. William is listed in the 1880 and 1900 U.S. Census in Hohokus, Bergen Co, New Jersey. William died 1901 in Hohokus and was buried at the Ramapo Reformed Church Cemetery in Mahwah, Bergen Co, New Jersey.
