

Individual Narrative of Richard⁷ Leverich Hedenberg [153]
Son of James VanAlst Hedenberg and Elizabeth⁶ Leverich [61]
Husband of Rebecca Cook Pierson
Husband of Gertrude Ogden Pierson

Richard Leverich Hedenberg^{1,2} was born on 23 Dec 1806 at Newtown, Queens Co, New York, the son of James Van Alst Hedenberg and Elizabeth Leverich. The birth date is a calculated date based upon Richard's age at the time of his death.³

Richard L. Hedenberg married Rebecca Cook Pierson, daughter of Elihu Pierson and Elizabeth Wheeler, on 25 Nov 1830 at Newark, Essex Co, New Jersey. Rebecca's parents are identified in the Bartlett and Leverich Family Tree owned by "historycraze" at Ancestry.com; also at findagrave.com; but no primary source has been identified.^{4,5,6,7}

On 4 October 1834, the following notice was published in the Newark Daily Advertiser. "At a meeting of the Whigs of the East Ward, Newark, held at the Park House on Friday evening October 3, 1834 ... (it was) resolved that the following persons be appointed a committee of Vigilance for the East Ward, whose duty it shall be to take the necessary measures for the promotion of the Whig cause." The committee included Richard L. Hedenberg.⁸

Rebecca C. Pierson was born at Newark, Essex County, New Jersey on 15 May 1813. Rebecca Pierson Hedenberg died at Newark on 15 March 1835 and was buried at the First Presbyterian Churchyard Memorial Garden in Newark.^{9,10}

Richard L. Hedenberg and Rebecca Cook Pierson had two children, one of whom survived to adulthood, but died young at the age of 38 in 1870.^{11,12}

- i. Elihu Pierson Hedenberg was born at Newark, Essex County, New Jersey about 1832. Elihu married Caroline A. Thomas 22 March 1854 at Newark. Elihu is found in the 1860 U.S. Census at Newark Ward 10. During the Civil War, Elihu enlisted in the union army 7 December 1861 at New York, and was mustered out 18 July 1865 at McDougal General Hospital in New York harbor. Elihu died at Newark 9 April 1870. His place of burial has not been determined. Elihu's widow Caroline is found in the 1880 U.S. Census at 64 Wright Street, Newark.^{13,14,15,16,17,18,19,20}
- ii. Rebecca P. Hedenberg was born at Newark, Essex Co, New Jersey 28 February 1835. Rebecca died as a child at Newark 19 November 1836. Rebecca was buried at the First Presbyterian Churchyard Memorial Garden in Newark.^{21,22,23}

In a deed dated 28 March 1836, in consideration of \$1000, Henry Alling sold land at High and Warren Streets in Newark to Richard L. Hedenberg and William Pickett. The deed was recorded 30 April 1836.²⁴

In a deed dated 1 October 1836, in consideration of \$9000, Henry Alling sold land at Bank and Boston Streets in Newark to Richard L. Hedenberg and Albert H. Woodruff. The deed was recorded 1 October 1836.²⁵

On 7 January 1837 the following notice was published in the *Newark Daily Advertiser*. "COPARTNERSHIP. The subscribers have entered into Copartnership under the firm of Hedenberg & Woodruff; for the purpose of Carriage Manufacturing. -- They have taken the shop lately built by Mr. H. Alling, situated at the head of Market and Bank Streets, a short distance west of High Street. Their patrons may rely on their personal attention to all orders. R.L. HEDENBERG. A.H. WOODRUFF."²⁶

Richard L. Hedenberg married for a second time on 9 August 1837 Gertrude Ogden Pierson at Newark, Essex Co, New Jersey. Gertrude was the sister of Richard's deceased first wife Rebecca C. Pierson. A marriage notice was published in the New York Morning Herald announcing the marriage at Newark of "R. L. Hedenberg of the firm of Hedenberg & Woodruff, to Gertrude Ogden, daughter of Elihu Pierson."^{27,28}

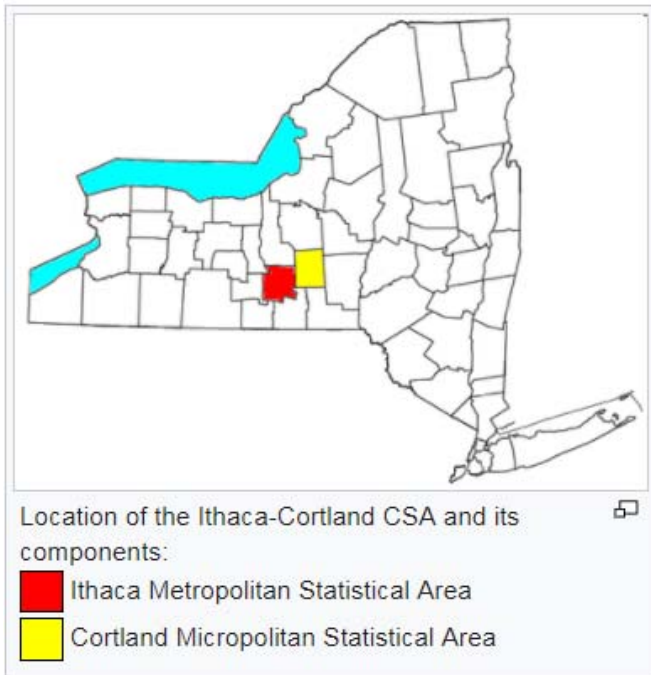
In a deed dated 2 October 1837, in consideration of \$2600, Henry Alling sold land at Academy St and Morris Canal to Richard L. Hedenberg and Albert H. Woodruff. The deed was recorded 5 October 1837.²⁹

Richard L. Hedenberg is listed in the 1838-1839 Newark City Directory: coachmaker, 66 Mulberry St.³⁰

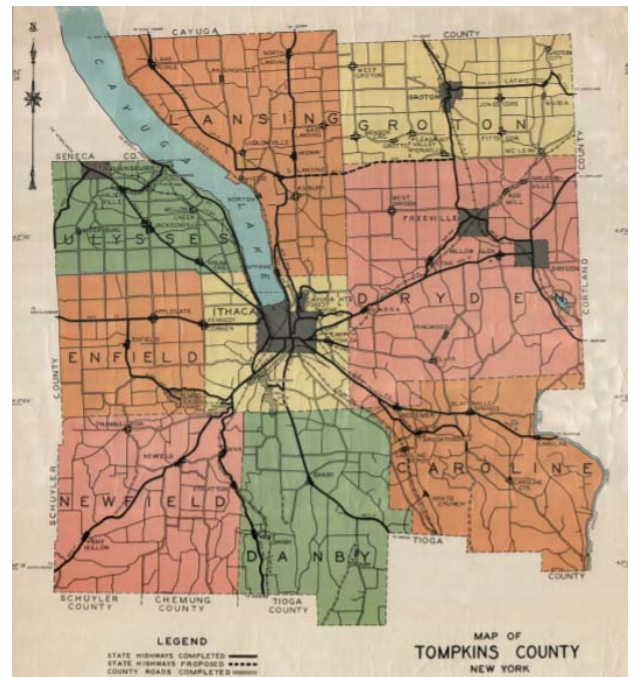
On 28 August 1840, a notice of Sheriff's Sale was published in the *Newark Daily Advertiser*: "In chancery of New Jersey -- between Cornelius Smith and Uriah J. Smith, Complainants, and Richard L. Hedenberg and Albert H. Woodruff and wife, defendants ... sale of mortgaged premises" Bank and Boston Street, Newark.³¹

Richard L. Hedenberg is not found in the 1840-1841 Newark City Directory, nor the 1840 U.S. Census. Richard's brother Edward L. Hedenberg is listed in the 1840-1841 Newark City Directory living at 66 Mulberry Street, which had been Richard's residence in 1838-1839.^{32,33,34}

By 1841, Richard L. Hedenberg appears to have relocated to Ithaca, Tompkins Co, New York. Further probate proceedings for Richard's uncle William Leverich who died in 1831 in Queens Co, New York provides a list of heirs living in 1841, which includes Richard L. Hedenberg of Ithaca, Tompkins Co, New York.^{35,36}

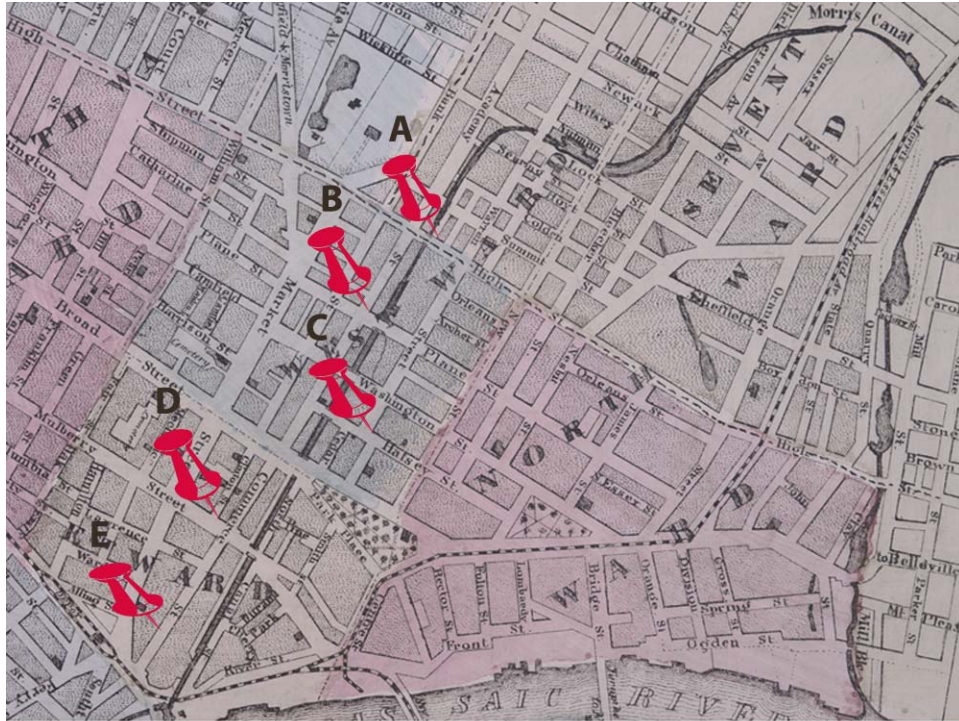
By 1846, Richard L. Hedenberg had returned to Newark, Essex Co, New Jersey where he is listed in the 1846-1847 Newark City Directory, coach manufacturer, living at 94 Commerce St.³⁷

In a deed dated 24 March 1846, in consideration of \$1600, Jefferson Ellis and his wife of Newark sold land to Richard L. Hedenberg, located on the southern side of Commerce Street bordering the lot of Robert Lavielle. The 1845-1846 Newark City Directory lists Jefferson Ellis living at 94 Commerce Street (east of Mulberry St on contemporary map of Newark). The deed was recorded on 1 April 1846.^{38,39}

"R. L. Hedenberg" (Richard L. Hedenberg), age 43, coachmaker, is recorded in the 1850 U.S. Census of Newark, East Ward, Essex County, New Jersey. Other members of the household included Richard's wife "G.O." (Gertrude O), his children, and his father James, tailor, age 83. Two of the children, "G.S." (George S.), age 7, and "A.O." (Alida O.), age 6, are listed as having been born in New York State, which provides supporting evidence of Richard's presence in

Tompkins Co, New York 1841-1845. The remaining children before and after George and Alida are recorded to have been born in New Jersey. The same State of birth pattern is found in the 1860 U.S. Census.^{40,41}

Richard L. Hedenberg is listed in the 1850-1851 Newark City Directory, coach manufacturer, 94 Commerce Street.⁴²

Richard L. and Gertrude Hedenberg are listed in 1851 as members of the First Baptist Church in Newark.⁴³

Richard L. Hedenberg is listed in the 1855-1856 Newark City Directory, coach manufacturer, 94 Commerce Street.⁴⁴

The following notices were published in the *Troy Daily Whig* on 20 April 1855.

"DISSOLUTION, COPARTNERSHIP heretofore existing between the subscribers was dissolved by mutual consent on the 3rd instant. The books will remain at the old stand, and will be settled by James (error in newspaper, actually David) Hedenberg, to whom all accounts may be paid, and all bills presented. Troy, April 11, 1855. SYLVESTER C. BALL, DAVID J. HEDENBERG."

"COPARTNERSHIP. THE UNDERSIGNED have this day entered into a copartnership under the name of D. J. Hedenberg and Brother, and will continue the Carriage Making and Repairing Business at the old stand, where by strict attention to business, they hope to merit a continuance of the patronage of their old customers and the public in general. Troy, April 11, 1855. DAVID J. HEDENBERG, RICHARD L. HEDENBERG. N B-- Coach Painting and Varnishing on the premises by Jesse Brown." The specific business relationship reflected in the partnership of Richard L. Hedenberg with his brother David J. Hedenberg of Troy, New York has not been determined. Richard however remained in Newark, New Jersey and did not relocate to Troy, New York.⁴⁵

The 1859-1860 Newark City Directory includes the following listings: Richard L. Hedenberg, coach manufacturer 210 Market Street, residence 94 Commerce St; Edward L. Hedenberg, coach manufacturer 210 Market Street, residence 84 Mulberry St; Hedenberg & Littell, Light carriage manufacturing 210 Market Street.⁴⁶

Richard L. Hedenberg, age 54, coachmaker, is recorded in the 1860 U.S. Census of Newark, Ward 4, Essex County, New Jersey. Other members of the household included wife Gertrude age 43; son George S., age 17, coach trimmer; daughter Alida O., age 15; daughter Rebecca P., age 12; daughter Elizabeth L., age 10; daughter Isabella, age 6; and son Jesse, age 3.⁴⁷

By 1865, Richard L. Hedenberg appears to have modified his occupation from coach manufacturer to wheelwright. He is so listed in the 1865-1866 Newark City Directory located at 59 Mechanic Street, residing at 94 Commerce Street.⁴⁸

Richard (incorrectly indexed as Robert) Hedenberg, age 62, wheelwright, is recorded in the 1870 U.S. Census of Newark, Ward 4, Essex County, New Jersey. Other members of the household included son George S., age 26, coach trimmer; daughter Rebecca (incorrectly recorded as Elizabeth), age 22; daughter Elizabeth, age 20; daughter Bell, age 17; son Chas (Jesse), age 9; daughter Gertrude, age 5. Richard's wife Gertrude is not listed, for unknown reasons.⁴⁹

Richard L. Hedenberg is listed in the 1870-1871 Newark City Directory, wheelwright, rear 85 Mechanic, residence 120 Commerce. Also listed is George S. Hedenberg, coach trimmer, home 120 Commerce.⁵⁰

Richard L. Hedenberg is listed in the 1875-1876 Newark City Directory, manufacturer wheels, fire engine wheels, rear 85 Mechanic; residence 120 Commerce.⁵¹

Richard L. Hedenberg, age 73, wheelwright, is recorded in the 1880 U.S. Census of Newark, Essex County, New Jersey. Other members of the household included his wife Gertrude O. Hedenberg, age 63; daughter Rebecca Baldwin, age 34; son Charles (Jesse), age 19; grandson William Baldwin, age 6; brother-in-law David Pierson, age 53; and Gertrude S. Ogden, age 84, boarder.⁵²

Richard L. Hedenberg is listed in the 1880-1881 and 1886-1887 Newark City Directory, manufacturer wheels, rear 85 Mechanic; residence 120 Commerce.^{53,54}

Richard Leverich Hedenberg died on 23 Apr 1887 at Newark, Essex, New Jersey, at age 80. Richard was buried at the Mount Pleasant Cemetery in Newark.^{55,56,57}

Richard L. Hedenberg made a will dated 15 February 1886 leaving his entire estate to his wife Gertrude and naming as executors his wife Gertrude and his son Jesse C. Hedenberg. The application for probate identified the following heirs: George S. Hedenberg, son, Newark, NJ; Lida O. Gillin, daughter, Washington, D.C.; Rebecca P. Baldwin, daughter, Washington, D.C.; Elizabeth Garside, daughter, Washington, D.C.; Isabel Oakley, daughter, Greenpoint, Long Island, New York; Jesse C. Hedenberg, son, Newark, New Jersey. The will was proved 4 May 1887 in the Essex Co, New Jersey Surrogate Court.⁵⁸

The 1889 Newark City Directory lists Gertrude Hedenberg, widow of Richard L. Hedenberg, home 120 Commerce Street.⁵⁹

The 1899 Newark City Directory lists George S. Hedenberg, carriage trimmer; and his daughter Bella A. Hedenberg, both living at 491 Summer Avenue.⁶⁰

Gertrude Hedenberg, widow age 82, is recorded in the 1900 Census of Brooklyn, Ward 17, Kings Co, New York. Gertrude is living with her daughter and son-in-law Isabella and Horatio W. Oakley at 650 Leonard Street, Brooklyn.⁶¹

Gertrude Ogden Pierson Hedenberg died 12 February 1901 in Brooklyn, Kings Co, New York. Gertrude was buried at the Mount Pleasant Cemetery in Newark, Essex Co, New Jersey.^{62,63}

Gertrude O. Hedenberg made a will dated 1 November 1890. The will directed that the estate be equally divided among surviving children. The application for probate in 1901 lists the following heirs: George S. Hedenberg, Newark; Lida O. Gillin, Washington D.C.; Rebecca P. DeHart, Rockaway, Morris Co, New Jersey; Elizabeth L. Garside, Newark; Belle

Oakley, Brooklyn, Kings Co, New York; and Jesse C. Hedenberg, Newark. The will was proved at the Essex Co, New Jersey Surrogate on 26 February 1901.⁶⁴

Richard Leverich Hedenberg and Gertrude Ogden Pierson had eight children, six of whom survived to adulthood.^{65,66}

- iii. George Spencer Hedenberg was born at Ithaca, Tompkins Co, New York on 9 August 1842. George married Katherine A. Pearsall 14 June 1871 at Jamaica, Queens Co, New York. The source of the marriage date and place is the Baldwin Family Tree at Ancestry.com. No primary source supporting this data has been found. George died at Newark, Essex Co, New Jersey on 10 January 1919. George is listed in the 1850, 1860, and 1870 U.S. Census of Newark, Essex County, New Jersey, living with his parents. George is listed in the 1880 U.S. Census in Jamaica, Queens Co, New York; and the 1900 and 1910 U.S. Census of Newark, Ward 8, Essex Co, New Jersey.^{67,68,69,70,71,72,73,74,75,76,77}
- iv. Alida Ogden Hedenberg was born at Ithaca, Tompkins Co, New York on 10 November 1844. Alida married 9 September 1868 Captain James Gillin at Newark, Essex Co, New Jersey. Alida died at Baltimore, Maryland (4105 Garrison Avenue) on 7 March 1916. Alida was buried at the Mount Pleasant Cemetery in Newark. Alida is listed in the 1850 and 1860 U.S. Census of Newark, Essex Co, New Jersey living with her parents. James and Alida Gillin are listed in the 1870 and 1880 U.S. Census of Newark; and the 1900 U.S. Census of Washington, D.C. Alida, widow, is listed in the 1910 U.S. Census of Washington, D.C. living in the household of her daughter Ada and son-in-law Hulbert Young.^{78,79,80,81,82,83,84,85,86,87,88,89,90}
- v. Rebecca Pierson Hedenberg was born at Newark, Essex Co, New Jersey on 7 September 1847. Rebecca married for the first time William James Baldwin on 11 June 1868 at Newark. Rebecca married for the second time Charles C. DeHart on 9 October 1890 at Newark. Between 1910 and 1920 the widow Rebecca changed her surname back to Baldwin. Rebecca P. Hedenberg Baldwin died at Madison, Middlesex Co, New Jersey on 19 February 1927. Rebecca was buried at the Mount Pleasant Cemetery in Newark. Rebecca was listed in the 1850 and 1860 U.S. Census of Newark, Essex Co, New Jersey living with her parents. Rebecca and William J. Baldwin are listed in the 1870 U.S. Census of Newark. The widow Rebecca Baldwin is listed in the 1880 U.S. Census of Newark living with her parents. Rebecca and Charles DeHart are listed in the 1900 Census of Rockaway, Morris Co, New Jersey. The widow Rebecca DeHart is listed in the 1910 U.S. Census of Newark. The widow Rebecca Baldwin is listed in the 1920 U.S. Census of East Orange, Essex Co, New Jersey.^{91,92,93,94,95,96,97,98,99,100,101,102}
- vi. Elizabeth Leverich Hedenberg was born at Newark, Essex Co, New Jersey on 16 February 1850. Elizabeth married John J. Garside about 1872, probably at Newark. The marriage date is based upon the 1900 U.S. Census. A specific date and place of marriage has not been determined. Elizabeth died at East Orange, Essex Co, NJ 9 July 1926. Elizabeth was buried at the Mount Pleasant Cemetery in Newark. Elizabeth is listed in the 1850, 1860, and 1870 U.S. Census in Newark living with her parents. Elizabeth and John J. Garside are recorded in the 1880 and 1900 U.S. Census of Newark. The widow Elizabeth Garside is recorded in the 1910 U.S. Census of Newark, and the 1920 U.S. Census of East Orange, Essex Co, New Jersey.^{103,104,105,106,107,108,109,110,111,112,113}
- vii. Isabella (aka Isabelle) Browne (as per Bartlett-Leverich Family Tree at Ancestry.com) Hedenberg was born at Newark, Essex Co, New Jersey, on 1 December 1853. Isabella married Horatio William Oakley 20 February 1876 at the First Baptist Church in Newark (according to the Baldwin Family Tree at Ancestry.com). Isabella died at an undetermined location between 1930 and 1940. The Baldwin Family Tree cites a death date and location as 31 January 1937 at Babylon, Nassau Co, New York, but does not provide a source. No other primary source for a date and location of death, or a place of burial, has been determined. Isabella is listed in the 1860 and 1870 U.S. Census of Newark, living with her parents. Isabella and Horatio Oakley are recorded in the 1880 and 1900 U.S. Census of Brooklyn, Kings Co, New York; 1910 U.S. Census of Newark; 1920 and 1930 U.S. Census of East Orange, Essex Co, New Jersey. Their daughter Gertrude is living with her parents in 1930 at 91 Steuben Street in East Orange. Gertrude is living at the same location in the 1940 U.S. Census, but her parents are not listed. Therefore it is assumed that her parents died in the 1930's. A primary source for Isabella's date and place of death, and place of burial, has not been determined.^{114,115,116,117,118,119,120,121,122,123,124,125}

- viii. Jesse Hedenberg was born at Newark in 1857, and died as a child in 1860. He was buried at the Mt Pleasant Cemetery in Newark 2 September 1860. The 1900 U.S. Census for Newark records that Gertrude Hedenberg, widow of Richard L. Hedenberg, had ten children, six of whom were living. Of the four remaining children, one survived to adulthood, i.e. Elihu Hedenberg, but he died young at the age of 38 in 1870. Rebecca P. Hedenberg died at the age of 21 months in 1836. Jesse Hedenberg died at the age of 3 years in 1860 as indicated above. And Gertrude Hedenberg died at the age of 11 in 1876, as indicated below.^{126,127,128,129}
- ix. Jesse Charles Hedenberg was born at Newark, Essex Co, New Jersey on 12 March 1861, and died unmarried at Newark 12 August 1916. Jesse was buried at the Mt. Pleasant Cemetery in Newark. Jesse is recorded in the U.S. Census of Newark in 1870 and 1880; the U.S. Census of Manhattan, New York Co, New York in 1900; and the U.S. Census of Newark in 1910.^{130,131,132,133,134,135,136}
- x. Gertrude Hedenberg was born at Newark, Essex County, New Jersey on 2 October 1864. Gertrude died at Newark as a child age 11 years, 7 months, and 23 days on 25 May 1876. Gertrude was buried at Mt. Pleasant Cemetery in Newark. Gertrude was recorded in the 1870 U.S. Census in Newark, age 5, living with her parents.^{137,138}
