

Individual Narrative of James⁷ S. Leverich [160]
Son of James⁶ Leverich [62] and Hannah Mott
Husband of Matilda Van Deride
Husband of Hannah L. Fox

James S. Leverich was born on 22 Dec 1805 probably at Brooklyn, Kings County, New York, the son of James Leverich and Hannah Mott. The middle initial "S" may mean "Sackett."^{1,2,3,4}

In a deed dated 13 February 1827, grantors William Leverich and Cornelia his wife of Newtown sold land to grantee James Leverich of Newtown, in consideration of \$4500. The property is described as a parcel of land in Newtown with house, barn, outhouses, and orchards; on the southern part by a road leading to the Mill lately belonging to James Larramore; on the western and northern part by land of Jacob Polhemus; and on the northern part from a small creek by land of Edward Greenoak; on the eastern part by land of said Edward Greenoak; and on the southeastern part by land late the property of John Hanson. The property contained 70 acres, being the same premises as were owned and occupied by the late James McDonough (husband of Hannah⁶ Leverich [56]), deceased. The deed was witnessed by James Lent, and recorded 24 June 1836.⁵

James Leverich married for the first time Matilda Van Deride on 14 Jun 1827 at Brooklyn, Kings County, New York. Matilda was born about 1810, probably in Brooklyn, the daughter of John Van Deride. The birth date is recorded in the Ancestry.com family tree entitled Bartlett and Leverich Genealogy, owned by John Bartlett, however no source is provided for the date. James and Matilda did not apparently have any known children.^{6,7}

Matilda Van Deride Leverich died 16 January 1833, either in Newtown or Brooklyn. The death date is recorded in the Ancestry.com family tree entitled Bartlett and Leverich Genealogy, owned by John Bartlett, however no source is provided for the date. A place of burial for Matilda has not been identified.⁸

James Leverich married for a second time Hannah L. Fox on 31 Dec 1834 at Camden, Camden County, New Jersey. The following marriage notice was published in the *Camden Mail and General Advertiser*. "In this city, on the 31st ult. by John K. Cowperthwait, Esquire: Mr. James Leverich of Long Island, to Miss Hannah L. Fox of this county, after a tedious courtship of three weeks.

Oh Cupid! who can hope to 'scape,
With reason, no one ought;
Since in a chase of three short weeks,
A sly young Fox was caught."^{9,10}

Hannah Fox was born about 1816 in New Jersey. Hannah's parents have not been identified.^{11,12}

James and Hannah Leverich are living in New Jersey about 1836, in which year their daughter Matilda was born.¹³

By 1838, James Leverich had located in Brooklyn, Kings County, New York, as per the Brooklyn City Directory.

- 1838-1839: J.S. Leverich, Carpenter, Navy near Wiloughby;
- 1839-1840: James Leverich, carpenter, Raymond near Myrtle.

A daughter Martha was born in New York about 1839.^{14,15}

By 1840 James Leverich had relocated to Newark, North Ward, Essex County, New Jersey, as per the 1840 U.S. Census. The census tallies record 1 free white male age 30-39 and 1 person employed in manufacture and trade (James Leverich, head of household, carpenter); 2 free white females under the age of 5 (daughters Matilda and Martha); 1 free white female age 20 to 29 (wife Hannah); also 1 free white male age 10 to 14, unidentified (perhaps a son by James' first wife, who died before 1850; or a carpenter's apprentice).¹⁶

James Leverich is listed in the Newark City Directory from 1840 to 1849.

- 1840-1841: James Leverich, Broad near Stone Bridge
- 1841-1844: James Leverich, carpenter, 38 North Broad Street
- 1844-1846: James Leverich, carpenter, 40 Bloomfield Avenue
- 1846-1848: James Leverich, carpenter, 46 Bloomfield Avenue
- 1848-1849: James Leverich, carpenter, 58 Sheffield
- 1849-1850: James Leverich, carpenter, 12 Webster.^{17,18,19,20,21,22,23,24,25,26}

James and Hannah Leverich are listed in the 1850 U.S. Census in Newark, North Ward, Essex Co, New Jersey. The household includes James, carpenter age 39, born NY; Hannah, age 36, born NJ; Matilda, age 14, born NJ; Martha, age 11, born NY; William, age 8, born NJ; John, age 6, born NJ; Charles, age 1, born NJ.²⁷

James and Hannah continued to live in Newark from 1850-1855, as so listed in the Newark City Directory.

- 1850-1855: James Leverich, carpenter, 650 High Street.

There is no listing for James in the Newark City Directory 1855-1857.^{28,29,30,31,32,33,34}

James and Hannah Leverich relocated to Camden, Camden Co, New Jersey in 1855, as per the 1855 New Jersey State Census.³⁵

In 1856, James and Hannah Leverich, as well as their daughters Matilda and Mary A, became members of the Union Methodist Episcopal Church, fifth and Mt. Vernon St, Camden.^{36,37}

James Leverich is recorded as head of household, age 51, house carpenter, in the 1860 U.S. Census, Camden, South Ward, Camden Co, New Jersey. The household also includes wife Hannah, age 44; daughter Matilda A., age 24, needle woman; daughter Martha A., age 21; son Charles H., age 11; daughter Mary, age 9; and daughter Alice, age 3.³⁸

James Leverich died on 24 Apr 1865 at Stockton, Camden County, New Jersey, at age 59. James was buried at the Bethel Memorial Park, Pennsauken, Camden Co, New Jersey.^{39,40}

Hannah Leverich, age 52, keeping house, is recorded in the 1870 U.S. Census of Camden, Middle Ward, Camden Co, New Jersey. Also included in the household are daughter Matilda Leverich, age 34, dress maker; daughter Mary Leverich, age 19, press feeder; and Alice Leverich, age 13.⁴¹ Hannah Leverich is listed in the 1870 Camden, New Jersey City Directory residing at 216 Plum Street.⁴²

Hannah Leverich, widow, is listed in the 1877 Camden, New Jersey City Directory residing at northeast corner Third and Arch Streets.⁴³

Hannah Leverich, age 64, widowed, is living in the household of her son Charles H. Leverich, age 31, retail grocer, 301 Arch Street, in the 1880 U.S. Census of Camden, Camden Co, New Jersey. Also included in the household is Mary A. Leverich, age 30, wife of Charles; and Mary C. Leverich, age 1, daughter of Charles.⁴⁴

Hannah Leverich, widow, is listed in the 1883 Camden City Directory, living at 1st Street above Burlington Pike. Listed at the same address are Hannah's children Charles H, salesman; Matilda E., press feeder Philadelphia; and William J., farmer.⁴⁵ Hannah Leverich is living in the household of her son Charles H. Leverich in the 1885 New Jersey State Census, Stockton, Camden County. Also included in the household is Charles' wife Mary; and daughters Rebecca and Mary Leverich.⁴⁶

Hannah Leverich is listed in the Camden City Directory between 1887 and 1894.

- 1887, 1890: Hannah Leverich, widow James, 1st Street near Master, C. Hill
- 1891: Hannah Leverich, widow James, 1st Street near High, C. Hill
- 1892: Hannah L. Leverich, widow James, Master near Cooper Avenue, C. Hill
- 1894: Hannah L. Leverich, widow James, 2725 Master C. Hill.^{47,48,49,50,51}

Hannah Leverich of Dudley, a neighborhood in Camden, widow of James Leverich, died 18 May 1895 at the home of her son-in-law Peter Lyle Weaver (spouse Alice F. Leverich) 2135 Susquehanna Avenue, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Funeral services were from the Dudley M.E. Church. Hannah was buried at Bethel Memorial Park, Pennsauken, Camden Co, New Jersey.^{52,53}

James S. Leverich and Hannah L. Fox had seven children, all of whom survived to adulthood. Four of these children married, but only one grandchild (Mary C, daughter of Charles H) was born.^{54,55,56}

- i. Matilda E. Leverich was born about November 1835 in New Jersey. Matilda, a dress maker, was never married. Matilda died in 1916, either in Philadelphia, Philadelphia Co, Pennsylvania; or Camden, Camden Co, New Jersey. Matilda was buried in Bethel Memorial Park, Pennsauken, Camden Co, New Jersey.^{57,58}
- ii. Martha A. Leverich was born about 1838 in Brooklyn, Kings Co, New York. Martha was never married. Martha died 21 November 1879 in Philadelphia, Philadelphia Co, Pennsylvania. Martha was buried at Bethel Memorial Park, Pennsauken, Camden Co, New Jersey.^{59,60,61}
- iii. William J. Leverich was born about 1842 at Newark, Essex Co, New Jersey. William married after 1880 Sarah A. (Sallie) Palmer. William died 9 October 1896 at Stockton, Camden Co, New Jersey. William was buried at the Colestown Cemetery, Colestown, Camden Co, New Jersey.^{62,63,64,65,66,67,68,69}
- iv. John F. Leverich was born about 1844 in Newark, Essex County, New Jersey. John was not married. John served in the civil war as a private Company D, 12th New Jersey Infantry Regiment. John died about 1868 in Trenton, Mercer Co, New Jersey. A place of burial has not been determined for John.^{70,71,72,73}
- v. Charles H. Leverich was born in January 1849 in Newark, Essex Co, New Jersey. Charles married Mary A. Wilson 22 June 1875 in Camden, Camden Co, New Jersey. Charles died 28 March 1895 at Camden, Camden Co, New Jersey. Charles was buried Arlington Cemetery, Pennsauken, Camden Co, New Jersey.^{74,75,76,77,78}
- vi. Mary L. Leverich was born 12 March 1851 in Newark, Essex County, New Jersey. Mary married for the first time James P. Cregar on 10 June 1872 in Camden, Camden Co, New Jersey. Mary married for the second time Stacy T. Gaunt on 10 September 1908 in Camden. Mary died 28 November 1949 in Woodbury, Camden Co, New Jersey. Mary was buried in Evergreen Cemetery, Camden, Camden Co, New Jersey.^{79,80,81,82,83,84,85}
- vii. Alice Fredericka Leverich was born 22 March 1857 in Camden, Camden Co, New Jersey. Alice married Capt. Peter Lyle Weaver 20 July 1883 at Dudley, Camden Co, New Jersey. Alice died 11 May 1931 at Abington, Montgomery Co, Pennsylvania. Alice. A place of burial has not been determined for Alice.^{86,87}
