

Individual Narrative of Richard⁷ Berrian Leverich [179] Son of Samuel⁶ Leverich [66] and Sarah Berrian Husband of Alletta Vandervoort

Richard Berrian Leverich was born on 17 Feb 1777 at Newtown, Queens County, New York, the son of Samuel Leverich and Sarah Berrian. The birth date was calculated based upon Richard's age at the time of death, i.e. age 49 years, 3 months, and 6 days on 25 May 1826, as transcribed by historian James Riker Jr. This would suggest that Richard was conceived prior to the date of his parents' marriage on 23 January 1777.^{1,2,3,4,5}

It should be noted that the birth and death dates recorded for Richard B. Leverich (1771-1820) at Findagrave.com are incorrect.⁶

Richard Berrian Leverich (1777-1826) of Newtown, son of Samuel, should not be confused with his first cousin once removed Richard Berrian Leverich (1782-1828) of Otisco, Onondaga Co, New York, son of Jesse. Their grandfathers William Leverich (husband of Dorothy Morse) and Samuel Leverich (husband of Deborah Wright) were brothers. Both Richards had a son Richard Berrian Leverich. Richard's (son of Samuel) son was known as Richard B. Leverich Jr, whereas Richard's (son of Jesse) son went by "Berrian" Leverich.⁷

Richard Berrian Leverich married Alletta Vandervoort on 13 May 1799 at Newtown, Queens, New York.⁸ Alletta Vandervoort Leverich was born 31 October 1773 at Newtown, Queens Co, New York, the daughter of Paul Vandervoort and Gertrude Polhemus.^{9,10,11}

The Raynham Hall Museum, operated by the Oyster Bay (Nassau Co, New York) Historical Society has a collection of "Leverich Family Papers". This collection includes a seventeen page receipt book belonging to Richard Leverich of Newtown, Long Island, containing receipts dated December 1800 to May 1811. Receipts were entered beginning at the back of the book and continued chronologically to the front of the book. There are a total of 23 entries for the following individuals: John Morrell, George Brinckerhoff, William Furman, Law Rapelye, Edward Waters, Garret Springstein, John Ludlum, Cornelius Remsen, William Deane, ?James Ginnings?, Peter Vandervoort, Frost Wright, Jonathan ?Ginnings?, Edward Leverich Jr., Garret Remson, Geshom Ludlam, Nathaniel Berrian, John Folk, Benjamin Lawrence, Abraham Springstein, Gabriel Leverich, Edward Webber, and Ruben Mead.¹²



In 1799, the State of New York enacted legislation providing for the collection of taxes on real estate and personal property. Richard Berrian Leverich Jr is recorded on the tax assessment roles at Newtown, Queens Co, New York for the year 1803, with real estate valued at \$500.¹³

On 1 May 1811, William Leverich as one of the executors of the estate of James Leverich, loaned \$2000 to Samuel Leverich and Sarah his wife. The loan was secured by a mortgage on 37.5 acres including house, barn and orchard, and bounded: southerly by the highway; easterly and southerly by land late of Howard Furman; northerly and easterly by a creek leading to Daniel Rapelye's Mill and meadow of Timothy Roach; westerly and northerly by meadow of Samuel Renny and Abraham Rapelye's meadow; westerly by meadow of the late William Sackett. The Indenture was dated 1 May 1811, and was witnessed by Richard B. Leverich and Benjamin Coe.^{14,15}

On 1 May 1811, A deed of sale for land & mortgage was executed in Newtown, Queens Co, New York from Richard and Alletta Leverich to the executors of the estate of William Sackett, i.e. Sackett Leverich, John Sackett, and Jonathan Sackett. The land was located in Newtown bounded southwardly by land of Richard B Leverich; eastwardly by the road leading to Daniel Rapelye's mills and then turning partly eastwardly along the land and meadow of Abraham Springstein; thence northwardly along the main creek leading to the said Daniel Rapelye's mill; and thence running northwardly and westwardly along the land of Samuel Leverich to the place of beginning, containing 10 acres. A mortgage of \$455.50 with interest at 5% per annum was signed by Richard B. Leverich and Alletta Leverich, and witnessed by James Hedenberg and Samuel Leverich.^{16,17}



On 20 May 1812 Nathaniel Berrian provided a receipt to Richard Leverich for the purchase of flax seed and sundries, with an accounting showing what Nathaniel Berrian owed to Richard Leverich. Nathaniel was both a cousin and brother-in-law to Richard.^{18,19}

According to the genealogical papers of Alletta Leverich Smith, Richard B. Leverich, son of Samuel, was enrolled during the War of 1812 for three months beginning 6 September 1814 as a Lieutenant in the 22nd Brigade of Infantry under General Jeremiah Johnson at Fort Greene in Brooklyn, Kings Co, New York. Richard's cousin Richard B. Leverich, son of Jesse, was also enrolled for the same time period during the War of 1812, as an ensign in the Queens County 64 and 93 consolidated regiment, commanded by Col John Ditmars and Captain Van Wyck Weeks.^{20,21}

On 5 April 1815, at the annual meeting of the Town of Newtown, Richard B. Leverich was appointed an Assessor, to serve for a period of one year.²²

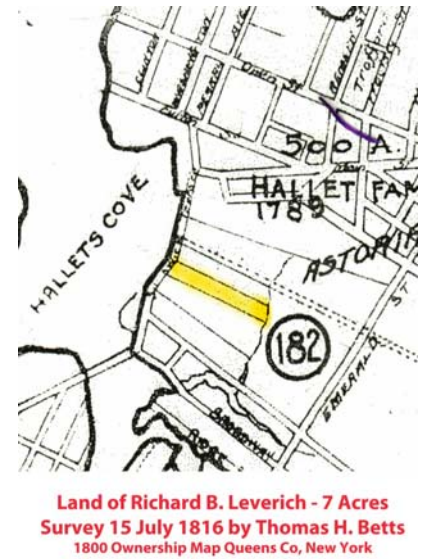
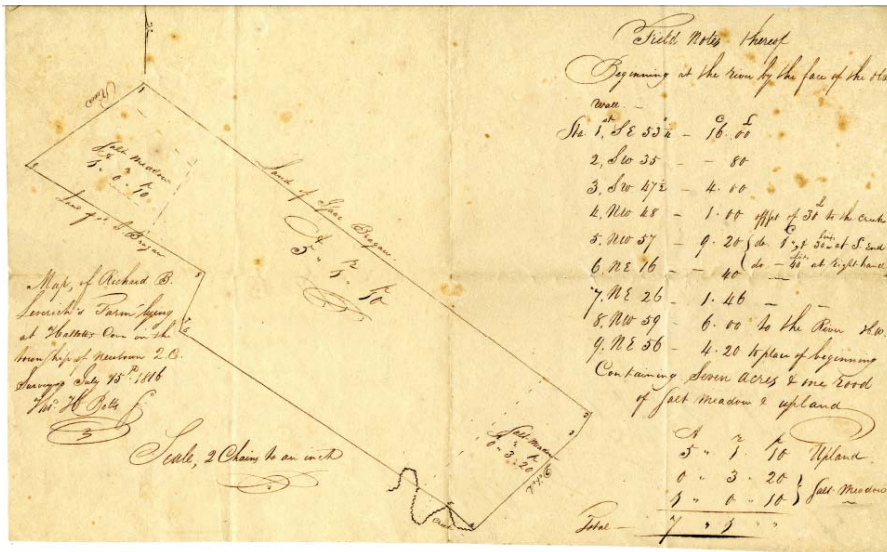
On 2 March 1816, William Kowenhoven of Brooklyn purchased a farm, including weaver's shop, from Richard B. Leverich. The terms were \$10 down on 2 March 1816, purchase price £2700, 2/3 due on 1 May 1816 if convenient, but otherwise not less than one half by 1 May 1816. The remaining balance was secured by the farm, bond, and mortgage at 6% per annum. Richard reserved rights to movables, except manure, and including the weavers shop until 1 May 1817; also 1/3 of grain in ground. Possession to be granted to William 1 April 1816. The weavers shop suggests that this was the property of Richard's father Samuel, who was a weaver, and who died in January 1816. The document is described as "terms of agreement" for sale of farm, and is not written in standard deed language of the time. It is signed by both Richard and William, and witnessed by Henry Field and Edward Leverich, dated 2 March 1816. The number of acres was not specified, and no property description was provided.²³

Samuel Leverich made a will dated 9 November 1815. In his will he names his wife Sally, his son Richard B. Leverich, and his daughter Deborah Berrian. Samuel named as executors of his estate his wife, son Richard B. Leverich, and Samuel Leverich Jr. The relationship of the latter is not identified, but it was likely his nephew, son of his brother Gabriel. His grandson Samuel, son of Richard B. Leverich, was too young at the time. The will was witnessed by Jacob Lane, Thomas Hunt, and Henry Field. The will was proved on 21 March 1816.²⁴

The following land transaction was executed on 1 May 1816. William Leverich, Cornelius Hyatt, Thomas Hyatt, executors of will of Thomas Hyatt of Newtown conveyed land to Adrian Van Sinderen. Adrian Van Sideren and Thomas Lawrence Jr conveyed land to Richard B. Leverich in a deed also dated 1 May 1816, but preserving the rights of James Lent and William Leverich who held a mortgage on the property in the amount of \$1500 plus accrued interest. The deed was recorded 2 June 1816.²⁵

Richard B. Leverich prepared a memorandum of payments out of his father's estate for the period March 9 to May 18, 1816. Payees included Deacon Richard Leverich, Samuel Leverich, William Leverich, Sarah Leverich, and Edward Leverich.²⁶

By 1816, Richard B. Leverich owned land located at Hallett's Cove. A map of this 7 acre tract surveyed 15 July 1816, is included among the the Leverich Family Papers at the Raynham House Museum.²⁷



In November 1816 Richard Leverich made out a receipt to Berrian and Leverich for purchases of posts, rails, etc.²⁸

On 13 November 1816 James Wilson made out an IOU to Berrian & Leverich for 8 pounds, 10 shillings, 10 pence.²⁹

On 1 June 1817 Ustick Stratton made out an IOU to Berrian & Leverich for \$123.25. The document was annotated by Richard B. Leverich noting a partial payment received on 7 December 1818.^{30,31}

Richard B. Leverich is recorded as a head of household in the 1820 U.S. Census of Newtown, Queens Co, New York. The census tallies list 2 free white males under age 10 (sons Richard B. Leverich and Peter V. Leverich); 1 free white male age 10 to 15 (son Samuel); 3 free white males age 26-44 (Richard B. Leverich Sr., 2 unidentified); 1 free white female age 10 to 15 (daughter Alletta); 1 free white female age 16 to 25 (daughter Sarah); 1 free white female age 26-44 (wife Alletta); and 1 free white female age 45 and over (mother Sarah). Son Paul V. Leverich, age 18, is unaccounted for. Paul likely was working out in another household.³²

On 1 May 1820 William Leverich Esquire provided a mortgage in the amount of \$3,000 to Richard B. Leverich and his wife Alletta in support of a land purchase provided to them on 1 May 1816 by Adrian Van Sinderen and Thomas Lawrence Jr, Executors of the will of Elizabeth Betts, late of Hallett's Cove, deceased. The land conveyed was bounded by the East River by the face of the old wall; and the land of Isaac Bragaw; 7 acres, 1 rod upland and salt meadow, as surveyed 15 July 1816 by Thomas H. Betts. The mortgage indenture was witnessed by Garret and Mary Furman.^{33,34}

On 14 February 1824 Richard B. Leverich and Alletta his wife of Newtown in consideration of \$500, quit claimed to Sarah Leverich, land already in her possession; located at Hallett's Cove; bounded northerly and easterly by lands of Isaac Bragaw; southerly by a creek and by land of Robert Moore; westerly and part southerly by lands of Isaac Bragaw; and

westerly by the East River. The property consisted of 12 acres more or less, lands already occupied by Sarah, which were conveyed by Adrian Van Sideren and Thomas Lawrence Jr to Richard B. Leverich in a deed dated 1 May 1816, but preserving the rights of James Lent and William Leverich who held a mortgage on the property in the amount of \$1500 plus accrued interest. The deed was witnessed by David Lamberson and Alletta Vandervoort, and recorded 15 March 1824.³⁵

Richard Berrian Leverich died on 23 May 1826 at Newtown, Queens Co, New York, at age 49 years, 3 months, and 6 days. Richard was buried at the Leverich Family Burial Ground in Newtown.^{36,37,38,39}

The 1830 U.S. Census records Richard Berrian Leverich (Jr.), age 21, a head of household in Newtown, Queens Co, New York. The census tallies list 2 free white males (Richard B. Jr, head of household and brother Samuel); 1 free white female under age 5 (unidentified); 2 free white females age 20 to 29 (sisters Sarah and Alletta). Richard's grandmother, Sarah, age 76; mother Alletta, age 57; and brother Peter V., age 19 are unaccounted for in this record as well as the 1830 census at large.⁴⁰

Alletta Leverich, widow of Richard B. Leverich, died at Newtown on 16 November 1837, age 64 years and 16 days. She was buried at the Leverich Family Burial Ground.^{41,42,43,44}

Richard Berrian Leverich and Alletta Vandervoort had six children, all of whom survived to adulthood. Three of these six married and had children.⁴⁵

- i. Sarah Berrian Leverich was born at Newtown 22 June 1800. Sarah died unmarried 28 August 1881 at Brooklyn, Kings Co, New York.^{46,47,48}
- ii. Paul Vandervoort Leverich was born at Newtown 1 June 1802. Paul died unmarried 2 April 1826 at Kingsbridge, Bronx Co, New York.^{49,50,51,52}
- iii. Alletta Polhemus Leverich was born at Newtown 17 September 1804. Alletta married 23 January 1833 Charles Smith at Manhattan, New York Co, New York. Alletta died at Great Barrington, Berkshire Co, Massachusetts 16 August 1872.^{53,54,55,56,57,58}
- iv. Samuel Leverich was born at Newtown 12 November 1806. Samuel died unmarried at Manhattan 8 October 1831.^{59,60,61,62}
- v. Richard Berrian Leverich Jr was born at Newtown 23 May 1809. Richard married 25 June 1845 Margaret Maria Schoonmaker at Brooklyn, Kings Co, New York. Richard died at Brooklyn 3 November 1869.^{63,64,65,66,67}
- vi. Peter Vandervoort Leverich was born at Newtown either 5 August or 28 August, 1811. Peter married for the first time Anna (unidentified) about 1854, and for the second time Ellen Hamilton c 1855-1860. It is possible that Anna and Ellen were the same individual. Peter died at Manhattan 23 October 1875.^{68,69,70,71,72,73,74,75}
