Individual Narrative of Hannah⁷ Leverich [184] Daughter of Gabriel⁶ Leverich [67] and Hannah Thorpe Wife of John Elderd

Hannah Leverich was born circa 1786 at Newtown, Queens, New York, the daughter of Gabriel Leverich and Hannah Thorpe. The birth year is a calculated estimate based upon Hannah's age 63, at the time she died in 1849.^{1,2}

Hannah Leverich married John Elderd on 22 Oct 1808 at Newtown, Queens, New York, at the Newtown Presbyterian Church. "Elderd" is the most common version of the surname found, however "Eldert" and "Eldred" are also found. For consistency, "Elderd" will be used throughout this individual narrative.³

Hannah Leverich Elderd was baptized as an adult on 29 June 1810 at St. George's Episcopal Church in Flushing, Queens Co, New York.⁴

John Elderd was baptized 27 July 1788 at the Grace Episcopal Church in Jamaica, Queens Co, New York. John was the son of Samuel Elderd and Hannah Bedell who were married at Grace Church 2 September 1783.⁵

John Elderd is recorded as a head of household in the 1810 U.S. Census of Flushing, Queens Co, New York. The census tallies note 1 free white male under age 10 (son Samuel); 1 free white male age 10 to 15 (unidentified); 1 free white male age 16 to 25 (John Sr); 1 free white female age 16 to 25 (wife Hannah).⁶

John Elderd is recorded as a head of household in the 1820 U.S. Census of Queens Co, New York. The 1820 census of Queens County does not identify townships. It is likely that John and Hannah were living in Flushing, as they had in 1810, although they have different neighbors. Their son John was baptized in 1819 at St George's Church in Flushing. The census tallies do not conform with known family members in 1820. There are two other John Eldert's in Queens Co in 1820, but the family sizes are too small to match our John Elderd, and the census tallies for the presumed heads of household are too old to be our John Elderd.⁷

On 13 May 1823 John Elderd of New York City purchased a lot of land from Jane Wright of New York City in consideration of \$800. The lot was designated Lot 102 and was located in Ward 9, bounded on the front by Schiefflin, on the east by Lot 104, and on the west by lot 100. The lot was 25 feet wide front and rear and 100 feet deep. The deed was recorded 19 May 1823.⁸

John and Hannah Elderd removed to Manhattan, New York County, New York between 1820 and 1830. There is no listing for them in the New York City Directory from 1820 to 1827. John Elderd first appears in the New York City Directory 1828-1829 living at 330 Broome Street, but no occupation is given.⁹

John Elderd is recorded as a head of household in the 1830 U.S. Census of Ward 12, Manhattan, New York Co, New York. The census tallies note 2 free white males age 5-9 (son George W, one unidentified); 1 free white male age 10 to 14 (son John Jr); 1 free white male 30 to 39 (unidentified); 1 free white male age 40-49 (John Elderd Sr); 1 free white female under age 5 (daughter Susan L); 1 free white female age 5 to 9 (daughter Sarah Amanda); 1 free white female age 15 to 19 (daughter Ann Eliza or Hannah - one is likely working out and living in another household); 1 free white female age 40-49 (wife Hannah). Son Samuel L (age 20) and daughter Mary Sophia (age 14) are unaccounted for. Both could be working out and living in another household.¹⁰

John Elderd is listed in both the 1830-1831 and 1831-1832 New York City Directories living at 88 Stanton, corner of Orchard. An occupation is not named. There is no listing for John Elderd during the period 1833-1841.^{11,12}

On 2 May 1831 John Elderd of New York City purchased 2 lots of land from Stephen Richard of New York City in consideration of \$300, bordering the lot (102) he purchased in 1823. The lots were located in Ward 12 (late Ward 9) and were bounded on the front by Schiefflin; on the west lots 96, 95, 14; on the north lots 16 and 18; **on the east lot 102.** The lots combined were 50 feet wide front and rear, and 100 feet deep. The deed was recorded on 2 May 1831.¹³

John Elderd is not found listed in the New York City Directory from 1833 to 1841. Nor is John Elderd found in the 1840 U.S. Census.^{14,15,16}

Gabriel Leverich, a brother of Hannah Leverich Elderd, names his sister Hannah as an heir in his will dated 12 February 1839.¹⁷

For the first time, Hannah Elderd, widow John, is listed in the New York City Directory 1842-1843 living at 14 Columbia. Hannah, widow John, is also found in the 1843-1844 New York City Directory living at 163 Essex.^{18,19}

Based upon New York City Directory entries, John Elderd likely died between 1832 and 1842. An exact date of death or burial has not been determined for John Elderd. No estate record has been found for John in the probate indexes at the New York County Surrogate's office.^{20,21} Hannah Leverich Elderd does not appear in the New York City Directory after 1844. Samuel L. Elderd, coachmaker and son of Hannah, is listed in the New York City Directory 1844-1849 living at 129 Suffolk in Manhattan. It is possible that Hannah was living in Samuel's household during this period of time.^{22,23}

Hannah Leverich Elderd died on 17 Jul 1849 at Brooklyn, Kings, New York.^{24,25,26,27} Gabriel Leverich, brother of Hannah Leverich Elderd, died in 1839. Newspaper notices listing heirs were published in 1857 and 1878. Ann Leverich, sister of Hannah Leverich Elderd, died in 1874. Letters of administration were granted on her estate, and the estate file also provides a list of heirs.^{28,29,30}

Hannah Leverich and John Eldert had eight children, all of whom survived to adulthood.

- i. Samuel Leverich Elderd was born in Flushing, Queens Co, New York circa 1810. Samuel was baptized 29 June 1810 at St. George's Episcopal Church in Flushing. Samuel married about 1832 Hannah Maria Lee in New York City, or possibly New Jersey. Samuel died 31 July 1880 in Bridgeport, Fairfield Co, Connecticut. A place of burial has not been determined for Samuel.^{31,32,33,34,35}
- ii. Ann Eliza Elderd was born in Flushing, Queens Co, New York circa 1812. Ann Eliza was baptized 19 July 1812 at St. George's Episcopal Church in Flushing. Ann Eliza was never married. Ann Eliza died 15 October 1885 in Manhattan, New York County, New York. Ann Eliza was buried at the Episcopal Church of the Epiphany in Manhattan.^{36,37,38,39}
- iii. Hannah Elderd was born in Flushing, Queens Co, New York circa 1814. Hannah was baptized 25 December 1814 at St. George's Episcopal Church in Flushing. Hannah was never married. Hannah died 12 August 1897 in Manhattan, New York Co, New York. Hannah was buried at the Woodlawn Cemetery in Bronx Co, New York.^{40,41,42,43}
- iv. Mary Sophia Elderd was born in Flushing, Queens Co, New York circa 1816. Mary was baptized 17 November 1816 at St. George's Episcopal Church in Flushing. Mary married 1 January 1846 John David Lee in the Episcopal Church of the Epiphany in Manhattan, New York Co, New York. Mary died 2 June 1854 in Manhattan and was buried at Trinity Church in Manhattan.^{44,45,46,47}
- v. John Elderd, Jr. was born in Flushing, Queens Co, New York circa 1819. John was baptized 4 April 1819 at St. George's Episcopal Church in Flushing. John was not known to have been married. John died circa January-February 1860 in Manhattan. Letters of Administration on John's estate were granted to his brother George W. Elderd 15 February 1860 in the New York Surrogate's Court. A place of burial has not been determined for John.^{48,49,50,51,52}

- vi. George W. Elderd was born either in Flushing, Queens Co or Manhattan, New York Co, New York circa 1822. The birth year is an estimate based upon census records. George married about 1844 Anne Hamil in New York City. The marriage year is also an estimate based upon census records. George died 18 October 1895 in Manhattan. George was buried in Woodlawn Cemetery in Bronx Co, New York.^{53,54,55,56,57}
- vii. Sarah Amanda Elderd was born either in Flushing, Queens Co or Manhattan, New York Co, New York circa 1824. The birth year is an estimate based upon census records. Sarah married 22 June 1845 Robert Humphrey Jeffrey in Manhattan. Sarah died 30 November 1879 in San Francisco, California. A burial place has not been determined for Sarah.^{58,59,60,61,62,63}
- viii. Susan Leverich Elderd was born in Manhattan, New York Co, New York on 9 March 1830. Susan married 15 September 1852 Jesse Abbott Shadbolt in Manhattan. Susan died 17 March 1901 in Stamford, Fairfield Co, Connecticut. Susan was buried in New Woodland Cemetery in Stamford.^{64,65,66,67,68,69}

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
