

Individual Narrative of Susan(nah)⁷ Leveridge [203] Daughter of John⁶ Leveridge [99] and Ann Chase Wife of John Ball

Susan(nah) Leveridge was born circa 1786 at Manhattan, New York Co, New York, the daughter of John Leveridge and Ann Chase. The birth year is a calculated estimate based upon U.S. and New York State census records. John Leveridge adopted the "idge" spelling, instead of the "ich" spelling, and this practice was carried on by his children and their descendants.^{1,2,3,4,5,6}

Susan Leveridge married John Ball on 12 Mar 1808 at Manhattan, New York Co, New York.⁷ John Ball was born circa 1786, but neither the place of his birth nor the identity of his parents have been determined. John's birth year is a calculated estimate based upon his age (58) when he died (1843).⁸

The 1810 U.S. Census records John Ball living in Manhattan, Ward 2, New York Co, New York. The census tallies include 1 free white male age 26 to 44 and 1 free white female age 26 to 44. This is likely John Ball and wife Susan Leveridge Ball, although both were age 24 at the time.⁹

John Ball, cabinet maker, is listed in the 1810 New York City Directory living at 13 Catherine Street, which was then located between Harman and Henry Streets. This location was also within two blocks of 115 Harman Street where Susan's parents John and Ann Leveridge were living.^{10,11}

The 1820 U.S. Census records John Ball living in Manhattan, Ward 2, New York Co, New York. The census tallies include 1 free white male under age 10 (son William H.); 1 free white male age 10 to 15 (possibly a John Ball Jr. reinterred 4 May 1853 at Green Wood Cemetery in Brooklyn, Kings Co, New York on the same date as his father John Ball Sr was reinterred having died in 1843); 1 free white male age 26 to 44 (John Ball Sr); 2 free white females under age 10 (daughters Anna and Susan); and 1 free white female age 26 to 44 (wife Susan).^{12,13,14}

John Ball, city marshal, is listed in the 1820 New York City Directory living at 115 Harman Street, in the same household as his mother-in-law the widow Ann Leveridge. This address was then likely located between Charlotte and East George Streets. John is holding the same political office formerly held by his father-in-law John Leveridge who died in 1812.^{15,16,17}

The 1830 U.S. Census records John Ball living in Manhattan, Ward 7, New York Co, New York. The census tallies include 2 free white males under age 5 (son Benjamin L. and unidentified); 1 free white male age 15 to 19 (son William H.); 2 free white males age 20 to 29 (possibly a John Ball Jr and an unidentified person); 1 free white male age 40 to 49 (John Ball Sr); 1 free white female under age 5 (unidentified); 2 free white females age 5 to 9 (daughter Adeline and unidentified); 2 free white females age 10 to 14 (daughters Anna and Susan); 1 free white female age 20 to 29 (unidentified); and 1 free white female age 30 to 39 (likely wife Susan, although she was age 44). All known family members are accounted for in these tallies, plus several unidentified persons. The unidentified persons could have been other unnamed children that did not survive to adulthood; and/or cabinet maker apprentices.¹⁸

John Ball Sr does not appear in 1830 New York City Directory. However, this directory does list Susan Ball, Tailoress, living at 144 Harman St., which was also the residence of her mother the widow Ann Leveridge. Harman Street would subsequently become East Broadway.¹⁹

The New York City Directory for the years 1831 to 1833 lists John Ball residing at 144 East Broadway. John is identified as a cabinet make in 1831 and 1833, and a turner at 95 Gold Street in 1832.^{20,21,22}

John Ball is listed in the 1834 and 1835 New York City Directories as a cabinet maker living at 30 Essex Street.^{23,24}

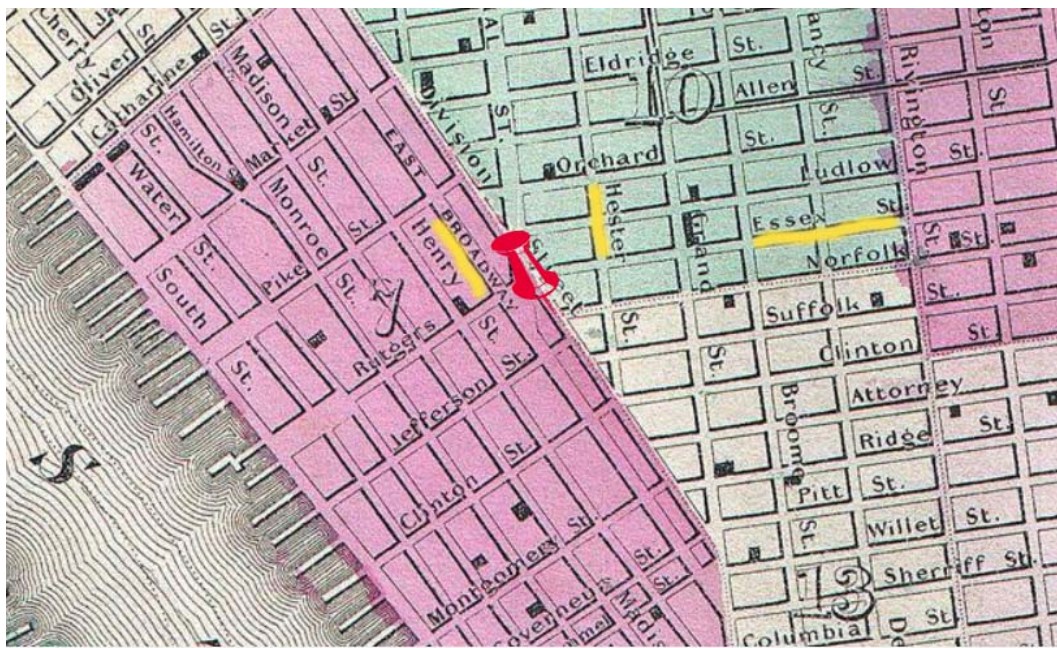
Neither John Ball, cabinet maker, nor Susan Leveridge Ball are found in the New York City directories for the years 1836 to 1841. During this period of time, John may have been serving in the military, and Susan continuing to reside at her mother's residence. See notes below regarding Letters of Administration on the estate of John Ball.^{25,26,27,28,29,30}

Susan (Leveridge) Ball is recorded as head of household in the 1840 U.S. Census of Manhattan, Ward 7, New York Co, New York. There is no census tally that would correspond to husband John Ball, then age 54, suggesting that John Ball was not residing in the household. He probably was serving in the military. The census tallies included 1 free white male age 10 to 14 (son Benjamin); 1 free white male age 20 to 29 (son William H); 3 free white females age 15 to 19 (daughters Anna <age 23>, Susan <age 21>, and Adeline <age 18>). There is no tally that would correspond to an assumed John Ball Jr, presumably age 30, suggesting that he had died prior to 1840. The census record also annotates 1 person employed in the "navigation of the ocean", presumably son William H. Ball, who is identified as a "mariner" in his death record. There are three other "John Ball's" recorded in Manhattan in the New York City Directory and the 1840 U.S. Census, but their census tallies do not include a "John Ball" age 54.^{31,32}

John Ball Sr. died 9 October 1843, age 58 (hence born c 1786) place unknown. Also unknown is his initial place of burial. Subsequently, he was reinterred at Green Wood Cemetery in Brooklyn, Kings Co, New York on 4 May 1853.^{33,34}

Letters of Administration on the estate of John Ball, late a marine in the service of the United States, were granted to Susan Ball, widow, on 3 November 1843, at the New York County Surrogate Court. Service in the U.S. Marine Corp may explain the absence of John Ball from the 1840 U.S. Census as well as the New York City Directories 1836 to 1843. A specific military service or widow's pension record for John Ball has not been located.³⁵

The New York City Directories 1845 to 1850 list Susan Ball, widow of John, living at 260 Division Street. This address was the border between Wards 7 & 13 and Wards 7 & 10. See Johnson's 1862 Ward Map for Manhattan.^{36,37,38,39,40,41}

The 1850 U.S. Census records a Susan Ball as head of household, age 64 (hence born circa 1786) living in Manhattan, Ward 13, New York Co, New York. The household includes children William H., Benjamin, Anna, Susan, and Adeline; also Phebe Ball, wife of Benjamin Ball. The other four children are all unmarried, and remained so for the duration of their life spans. The ages recorded for the children of John and Susan Ball in the 1850 to 1880 U.S. Census records are inconsistent, and in some instances significantly inaccurate. Therefore census ages for the children are not used in this narrative. Subsequent citations of birth years for these children are all based upon the individual's age at the time they died, as per their death records. Birth order is also based upon age at time of death. A subsequent analysis below will compare average ages per census records with ages per death records.⁴²

The birth years based on age at time of death for the children of John and Susan Ball are as follows: William H., 1812; Anna, 1817; Susan, 1819; Adeline, 1822; and Benjamin, 1828. The birth years based upon the Census Records average of Federal 1850 through 1880 and the New York State 1855 are as follows: William H., 1814; Anna, 1825; Susan, 1830; Adeline, 1831; and Benjamin, 1827. It is possible that there were additional children, unidentified, that did not survive to adulthood. Source citations are generic in nature.^{43,44,45,46,47,48,49,50,51}

The 1855 New York State Census records a Susan Ball as head of household, age 69 (hence born circa 1786) living in Manhattan, Ward 10, New York Co, New York. The household includes children William H., Ann Maria, Susan Matilda, and Adeline.⁵²

Susan Ball, widow of John, is listed in the 1856 and 1857 New York City Directories living at 59 Hester Street, which was located in Ward 10.^{53,54,55}

The 1860 U.S. Census records a Susan Ball as head of household, age 74 (hence born circa 1786) living in Manhattan, Ward 10, District 1, New York Co, New York. The household includes children William H., (Anna) Maria, Susan, and Adeline.⁵⁶

The 1870 U.S. Census records a Susan Ball as head of household, age 80 (actually age 84 hence born circa 1786) living in Manhattan, Ward 10, District 7, New York Co, New York. The household includes children Benjamin (and his wife Phebe, daughters Bertha and Louisa), Susan, Ann M., and Adeline.⁵⁷

Susan Ball, widow of John, is listed in the 1870 New York City Directory, living at 50 Hester Street.⁵⁸

Susan Leveridge Ball moved from Manhattan, New York Co, New York to Williamsburg, Kings Co, New York between 1875 and 1880. Susan is listed in the 1875 New York City Directory living at 50 Hester Street. Susan is listed in the 1880 Brooklyn City Directory living at 122 South 1st Street in Williamsburg.^{59,60}

The 1880 U.S. Census records a Susan Ball as head of household, age 90 (actually age 94 hence born circa 1786) living in Brooklyn (actually Williamsburg), Kings Co, New York. The household includes children (Anna) Maria and Susan M, and a William Ball, age 28, a painter incorrectly identified by the census as a "brother", actually a grandson, the son of Benjamin L. Ball (see 1860 U.S. Census of Manhattan, Ward 10).^{61,62}

Susan(nah) Leveridge Ball died on 22 Mar 1883 at Williamsburg, Kings County, New York. She was buried at Green Wood Cemetery in Brooklyn, Kings Co, New York.^{63,64,65}

Susan(nah) Leveridge Ball and her husband John Ball had five children that survived to adulthood. The gaps in birth years suggest that there may have been other children, unidentified, that died young.⁶⁶

- i. William H. Ball was born in Manhattan, New York County, New York circa 1812. William was a mariner. William never married. William died 15 September 1874 in Manhattan and was buried at Green Wood Cemetery in Brooklyn, Kings Co, New York.^{67,68}
- ii. Anna Maria Ball was born in Manhattan, New York County, New York circa 1817. Anna was a dress maker. Anna never married. Anna died 12 January 1898 in Brooklyn, Kings Co, New York and was buried at Green Wood Cemetery in Brooklyn.^{69,70,71}
- iii. Susan Matilda Ball was born in Manhattan, New York County, New York circa 1819. Susan was a dress maker. Susan never married. Susan died 2 July 1908 in Brooklyn, Kings Co, New York and was buried at Green Wood Cemetery in Brooklyn.^{72,73,74}
- iv. Adeline Jane Ball was born in Manhattan, New York County, New York circa 1822. Adeline was a vest maker. Adeline never married. Adeline died 21 November 1905 in Brooklyn, Kings Co, New York and was buried at Green Wood Cemetery in Brooklyn.^{75,76,77}

- v. Benjamin L. Ball was born in Manhattan, New York County, New York circa 1828. Benjamin was a sash maker. Benjamin married Phoebe Ann Rikel 5 May 1850 in Manhattan. Benjamin died 23 July 1905 in Brooklyn, Kings County, New York and was buried at Green Wood Cemetery in Brooklyn.^{78,79,80}
