

## **Individual Narrative of Caleb<sup>7</sup> Leverich [220] Son of John<sup>6</sup> Leverich [102] and Mary Brundage Husband of Susan(nah) Johnston Lane**

Caleb Leverich was born on 1 June 1801 at North Castle, Westchester County, New York, the son of John Leverich and Mary Brundage. John Leverich was living in the Town of North Castle in the 1800 U.S. Census.<sup>1,2,3</sup>

Caleb Leverich was married to Susan(nah) Johnston Lane on 18 August 1821 by the Rev. Silas Constant of the Presbyterian Church at the Town of Yorktown in Westchester County, New York.<sup>4,5</sup>

Susannah J Lane was born 19 September 1797, probably at Yorktown, Westchester County, New York, the daughter of Peter Lane and Elizabeth Burgess. Susannah was baptized (date not specified) by the Rev. Silas Constant of the Presbyterian Church at Yorktown. Peter Lane and Susannah Lane were listed as becoming members of the Presbyterian Church at Yorktown after 1786. It was further noted that Susannah presented herself for membership in this church and was accepted on 19-20 April 1816.<sup>6,7,8,9</sup>

Elizabeth Burgess, prior to marrying Peter Lane, was the wife of Thomas Blanchet, who enlisted in the continental army during the revolutionary war and at the time of marrying Elizabeth in 1778 was a private in Captain Vanoy's company of the Tenth North Carolina Regiment. Thomas was taken prisoner in 1779 and died in prison at Charlotte, South Carolina. Peter Lane also served in the revolutionary war as a Sergeant in Samuel Drake's Regiment, the 3rd Westchester County Militia formed in the manor of Cortlandt.<sup>10,11,12,13</sup> Benjamin Leverich, an uncle of Caleb Leverich, also served in this Westchester County militia unit.

Caleb Leverich and his wife Susannah lived in Manhattan, New York County, New York from 1822 to 1847. Caleb is listed in the New York City Directory for these years, identified as a cartman. At this time, a "cartman" was a person who transported goods or people by horse and cart. In 1822-1823 to 1824-1825, they resided at Sullivan near Houston. In 1825-1826 to 1827-1828 they lived at Laurens near Spring. In 1828-1829 they resided at 59 McDougal Street. In 1828-1829 they lived at 85 King Street.<sup>14,15,16,17,18</sup>

On 9 August 1828 Caleb Leverich is listed as a member of the Methodist Episcopal Church.<sup>19</sup>

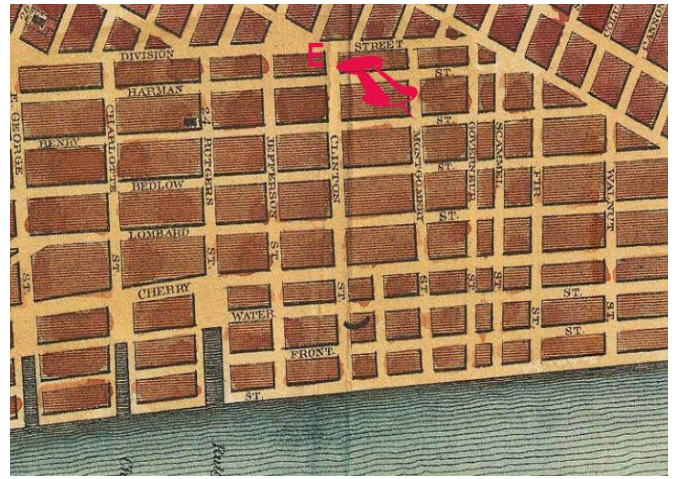
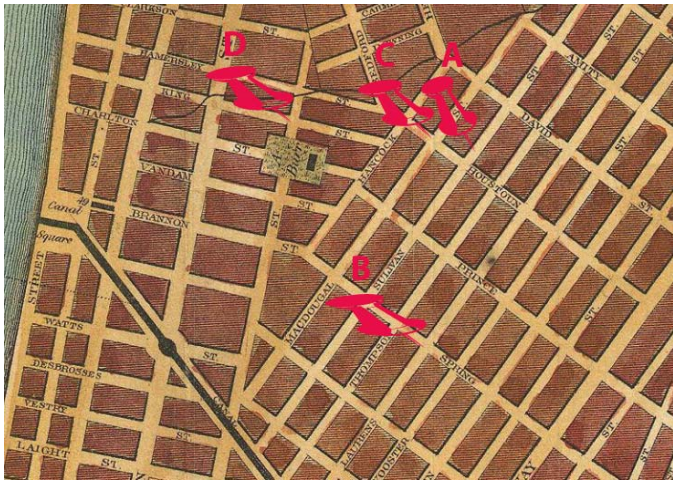
Caleb Leverich is recorded in the 1830 U.S. Census of Manhattan, Ward 8, New York County, New York residing on King Street. The census tallies included 1 free white male age 5 to 9 (son Benjamin); 1 free white male age 20 to 29 (head of household Caleb); 1 free white female age 30 to 39 (wife Susannah).<sup>20</sup>

Caleb Leverich is listed in the New York City Directory 1830-1831 to 1840-1841 living at 69 King Street (northwest corner of Varick Street), and identified as a cartman.<sup>21,22</sup>

Caleb Leverich is recorded in the 1840 U.S. Census of Manhattan, Ward 8, New York County, New York. The census tallies included 1 free white male age under 5 (son William H.); 1 free white male age 15 to 19 (son Benjamin); 1 free white male age 30 to 39 (head of household Caleb); 1 free white female under age 5 (daughter Susan Ann); 2 free white females age 5 to 9 (daughters Mary and Esther); 1 free white female age 15 to 19 (unidentified); 1 free white female age 40 to 49 (wife Susannah); 1 free white female age 80 to 89 (mother-in-law Elizabeth Burgess Lane).<sup>23</sup>

John Leverich made a will dated 21 October 1841 in Westchester Co, New York. John identifies Caleb Leverich as a son, and designates Caleb and his brother-in-law Stephen Gregory as executors of John's estate.<sup>24</sup>

Caleb Leverich is listed in the New York City Directory 1841-1842 to 1847-1848 living at 282 Henry Street (northwest corner of Montgomery Street), identified as a cartman.<sup>25,26</sup>



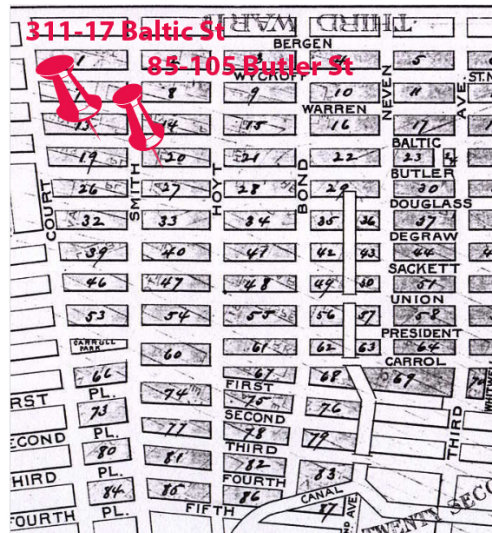
**A-Sullivan near Houston. B-Laurens near Spring. C-59 McDougal. D-85 and 69 King. E-282 Henry.**

Caleb Leverich is identified as a member of the Willet's Street Methodist Episcopal Church in Manhattan in 1842-1843. Caleb is noted as having removed from this Church 1846-1847.<sup>27</sup>

Caleb Leverich relocated to Brooklyn, Kings County, New York circa 1848. Caleb is listed in the Brooklyn City Directory 1848-1849 to 1853-1854: brickyard, foot of Joralemon Street, residence 33 Baltic Street (between Court and Smith Streets).<sup>28,29</sup>

Caleb Leverich is recorded in the 1850 U.S. Census of Brooklyn, Ward 10 (formerly Ward 6), Kings County, New York. The household included Caleb, age 49, brick merchant; wife Susan, age 52; daughter Mary age 19; daughter Esther age 16; son William age 13; and daughter Susan age 10. The value of Caleb's real estate is listed as \$2000.<sup>30</sup>

Between 1847 and 1852 Caleb Leverich acquired multiple lots of land on the north side of Baltic Street (between Court and Smith) and the north side of Butler Street (between Smith and Hoyt) located in Ward 10 (prior to 1850, Ward 6). The lots averaged 25 feet by 100 feet in size. The lots were distributed among Caleb's children as per his will prepared in 1874. Using post-1873 house numbers, the lots cited in Caleb's will were 311 (primary residence, formerly number 33), 313, 315, and 317 Baltic Street; 85, 87, 89, 91, 93, 95, 97, 103, and 105 Butler Street. Not included in these numbers are three lots on the south side of Baltic purchased by Caleb in 1852 from the Brooklyn Board of Education which had public school 6 located on the site. At an undetermined point in time, it would appear that the Board of Education recovered ownership of these lots, and there is a contemporary public school located on the site today in 2020.<sup>31,32</sup>

In 1851, Caleb Leverich, an enthusiastic religionist, fitted up a small room at 313 Baltic street, for prayer meetings. Out of this ultimately grew the Warren Street Methodist Episcopal Church. By 1853, the Rev. Mr. William F. Collins had charge of the Warren Street Mission where he preached on Sabbath afternoons. The Warren Street Methodist Episcopal Church, with which Caleb and Susannah Leverich were periodically associated, was formally dedicated for divine worship on 24 June 1860. The Church was then located at 303 Warren Street, between Smith and Court Streets.<sup>33,34,35</sup>

While retaining possession of his real estate in Brooklyn, Caleb Leverich relocated to the Town of Cortlandt in Westchester County circa 1854. He is not listed in either the New York City or Brooklyn City Directory for the years 1854-1855 to 1864-1865. On 18 September 1854 Caleb purchased from Ebenezer Strang of Yorktown, Westchester County, 152 acres mostly in Cortlandt, Westchester County, but partially in Putnam Valley, Putnam County, New York, in consideration of \$11,743. This tract of land included a school house, and was crossed by three public roads, i.e. Peekskill Hollow Road, Old Red Mill Road, and Red Mill Road. This tract of land was also located north west of the farm earlier owned by Caleb's father John Leverich, which his estate subsequently sold to Smith James. Caleb and Susan Leverich sold his tract of land to Joseph Nickerson on 27 April 1868, in consideration of \$22,000.<sup>36,37,38,39,40,41</sup>

Caleb Leverich was appointed a grand juror to serve on 7 June 1858 at a Court of Sessions and County Court, to be held at the courthouse in Bedford, Westchester County, New York.<sup>42</sup>

Caleb Leverich, farmer age 59, is recorded in the 1860 U.S. Census of Cortlandt, Westchester County, New York. The household included Caleb, age 59, farmer; wife Susan J. age 63; and daughter Susan A. age 20. The value of Caleb's real estate is given as \$1300 and the value of his personal estate is given as \$2000.<sup>43</sup>

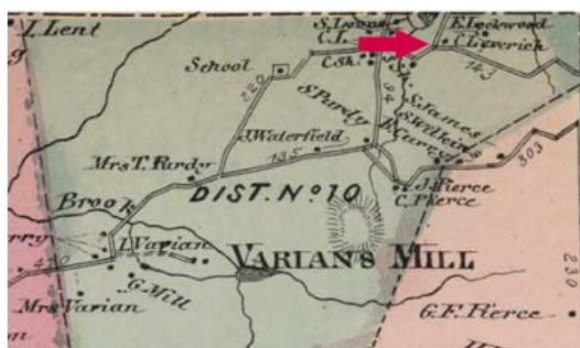
In addition to his farm in Cortlandt Township, Caleb appears to have owned another property in the town of Yorktown, located on the contemporary Foothill Road, near the border between Westchester and Putnam counties. Caleb is shown at this location in both the 1858 Dripps Atlas and the 1868 Beers Atlas. No deed has been found for this documenting either the acquisition or the sale of this plot. However, a property description in a 1927 Superior Court case in Putnam County includes a reference to a lot "late of Caleb Leverich" in the town of Yorktown, Westchester County, referencing the same general location as indicated on the above described county atlases.<sup>44</sup>

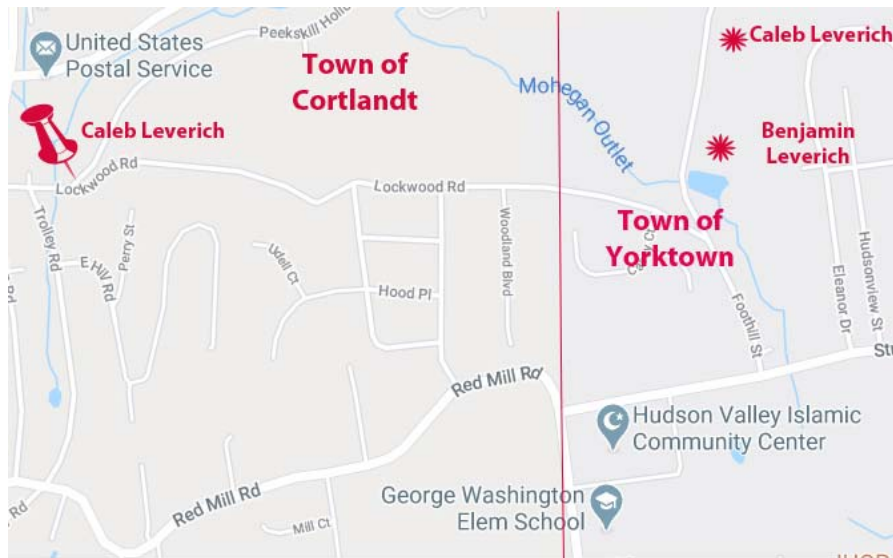

About 1865, Caleb Leverich left Westchester County and returned to a residence in Brooklyn, Kings County, New York. In the Brooklyn City Directory 1865-1866 to 1874-1875 Caleb is listed as "Brickyard foot of Joralemon, residence 33 Baltic". 33 Baltic became 311 Baltic in 1873 when house numbers in Brooklyn were changed. This Baltic Street residence was located between Court and Smith Streets.<sup>45,46</sup>

Caleb Leverich is recorded in the 1870 U.S. Census of Brooklyn, Ward 10, Kings County, New York. The household included Caleb, age 69, retired brick dealer, and Susan J. age 73. The value of Caleb's real estate is given as \$40,000. The value of Caleb's personal estate is given as \$25,000. The 1870 U.S. Census of Cortlandt, Westchester County, records Joseph Nickerson, to whom Caleb had sold his Cortlandt farm in 1868. Nearby Joseph are recorded Stephen Wilkins, brother-in-law of Caleb, as well as Benjamin Leverich, brother of Caleb.<sup>47,48</sup>

Caleb Leverich died on 24 Oct 1874 at Brooklyn, Kings County, New York, at age 73. His funeral was held from the Warren Street Methodist Episcopal Church. Caleb was buried at the Green-Wood Cemetery in Brooklyn.<sup>49,50,51</sup>

Caleb Leverich prepared a will dated 28 February 1874. The will was proved 24 November 1874. In his will, Caleb identifies the following heirs: wife Susan J.; son Benjamin B. and daughter-in-law Sarah A.; son William H. and daughter-in-law Deborah E.; daughter Mary E. Blair and son-in-law George C. Blair; daughter Esther W. Duncan and son-in-law William E. Duncan; daughter Susan A. Travis and son-in-law Cyrus H. Travis. Caleb's three sons-in-law were named executors of the estate. The will was witnessed by Stephen B. Jacobs and Frank Reynolds. Caleb's real estate was distributed among his wife and children: Baltic Street number 311 wife Susan; 313 daughter Susan Travis; 315 and 317 William H. Leverich; Butler Street number 85, 87, 89 Benjamin B. Leverich; 91 and 93 William H. Leverich; 95 and 97 daughter Susan Travis; 103 and 105 daughter Esther Duncan. For unknown reasons, daughter Mary E. and her husband George C. Blair were not included in the distribution of real estate. The inventory value of the estate was \$42,563 (which is the equivalent of about \$892,000 in 2019 dollars). In addition, Caleb provided for multiple cash legacies for each of his children and their respective spouses.<sup>52,53</sup>

The widow Susan J. Leverich, age 77, is listed in the 1875 New York State Census of Brooklyn, Ward 10, Kings County, New York, living with her daughter Susan A. Travis, her son-in-law Cyrus H. Travis, and her grandson Frank C. Travis. The Brooklyn City Directory for 1875-1876 lists Susan J. Leverich, widow Caleb, living at 311 Baltic Street.<sup>54,55</sup>

Susan J. Leverich, widow of Caleb Leverich, died on 13 August 1877 at her residence 315 Court Street in Brooklyn, Kings Co, New York. Her funeral was held from the Warren Street Methodist Episcopal Church. Susan was buried at Green-Wood Cemetery in Brooklyn.<sup>56,57,58</sup>



Caleb Leverich and Susan(nah) Johnston Lane had five children.<sup>59,60</sup>

- i. Benjamin B. Leverich was born 16 March 1823 in Manhattan, New York County, New York. Benjamin married Sarah Ann Barton 28 May 1844 in Manhattan. Benjamin died 28 December 1881 in Brooklyn, Kings County, New York. Benjamin was buried at Green-Wood Cemetery in Brooklyn.<sup>61,62,63</sup>
- ii. Mary Elizabeth Leverich was born 25 October 1830 in Manhattan, New York County, New York. Mary E. married George C. Blair 6 November 1850 at Brooklyn, Kings County, New York. Mary E. Leverich Blair died 3 December 1911 at Brooklyn. She was buried at Green-wood Cemetery in Brooklyn.<sup>64,65,66,67,68</sup>
- iii. Esther Weeks Leverich was born 26 January 1833 in Manhattan, New York County, New York. Esther married William E. Duncan 22 March 1854 in Brooklyn, Kings County, New York. Esther W. Leverich Duncan died 24 September 1923 at Oroville, Butte County, California. She was buried at the Oroville Cemetery.<sup>69,70,71</sup>

- iv. William H. Leverich was born 11 July 1837 in Manhattan, New York County, New York. William married Deborah E. (Butler) Sergeant 3 July 1861 in Manhattan. William died 7 September 1900 at Brooklyn, Kings County, New York. He was buried at Green-wood Cemetery in Brooklyn.<sup>72,73,74,75</sup>
- v. Susan Ann Leverich was born 19 February 1840 in Manhattan, New York County, New York. Susan married Cyrus H. Travis circa 1861 probably in Westchester County, New York. Susan Ann Leverich Travis died 12 April 1902 at Putnam Valley, Putnam County, New York. She was buried at Hillside Cemetery, Cortlandt Township, Westchester County, New York.<sup>76,77,78,79</sup>
