

Individual Narrative of Nathan⁸ Woodhull Leverich [226] Son of Richard⁷ Berrian Leverich [122] and Mary Van Wickel Husband of Bethia Wilkins and Phoebe Turner, widow Smith

Nathan Woodhull Leverich was born on 23 April 1813 at Newtown, Queens Co, New York. Nathan was the son of Richard Berrian Leverich and Mary Van Wickel. Circa 1817, Richard and Mary and children, including Nathan about four years old, left Newtown and settled in Otisco, Onondaga Co, New York.^{1,2,3}

In a deed dated 9 May 1817 John Bassett and his wife Anna of Bushwick, Kings Co, New York sold land to Richard B. Leverich of Newtown, Queens Co, New York in consideration of \$236.25. The land was located in the Town of Otisco, formerly the town of Pompey, Onondaga Co, New York: Lot number 10 in the Subdivision of Great Lot No. 55; bounded on the west by Lot 9 in the possession of John Degolyer; bounded on the north by Lot 8 in the possession of Eleazer Slocum, running east so as to contain 97.5 acres. The deed was witnessed on 15 May 1817 by Richard Hatfield, Master in Chancery. The deed was recorded in Onondaga Co, New York on 11 August 1817 by Cutler Leonard, Deputy Clerk.⁴

Richard B. Leverich died at Otisco on 11 August 1828 when his son Nathan Woodhull Leverich was about 15 years old.⁵

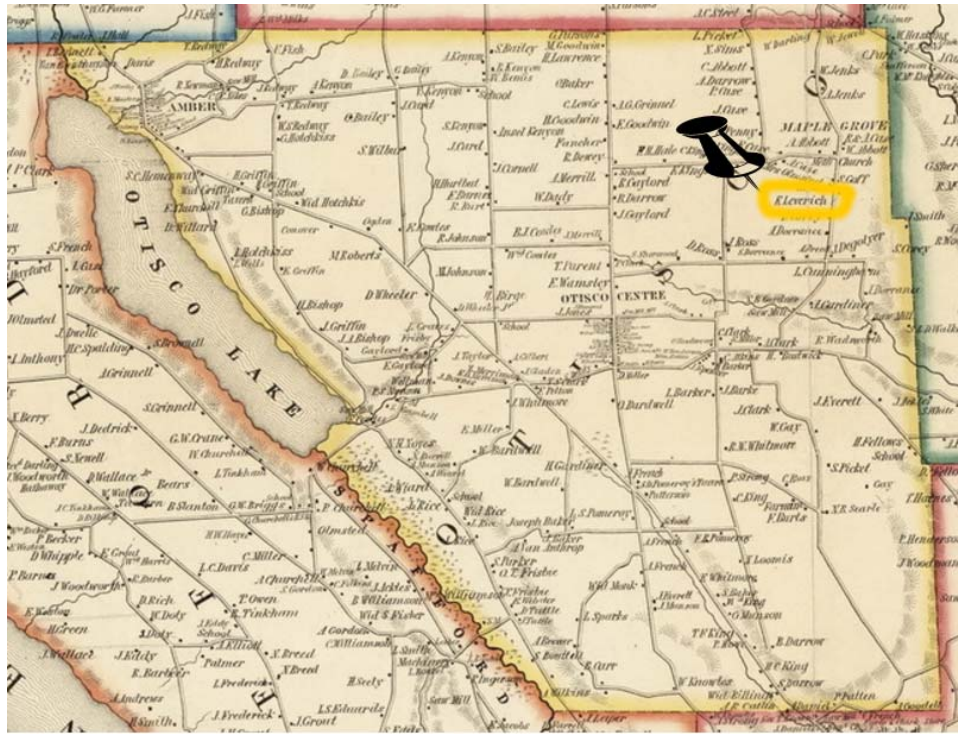


Onondaga Co NY Townships

Nathan W. Leverich was identified as a grandson of Jesse Leverich in documents associated with the probate of Jesse's estate: "Discharge of Executors" 14 June 1833, and "Discharge by grandchildren" 4 March 1842.^{6,7}

On 30 October 1838 Eleazer Slocum and his wife Elizabeth of Otisco in consideration of \$3,799.68 sold to Nathan W. Leverich a tract of land described as Lot 55 in the town of Otisco, originally the town of Pompey, subdivision number 8, comprising 58 acres; also included in the sale was a tract of land described as Lot 56 in the town of Lafayette, originally the town of Pompey, comprising a total of 50 acres. The two tracts were likely contiguous, although located in two townships. This land in Otisco appears to be the farm which had been purchased in 1817 by Nathan's father Richard B. Leverich, a total of 97.5 acres. The deed was recorded on 18 August 1842. The difference in acres of 10.5 acres has not been accounted for.⁸

Nathan W. Leverich married Bethia Wilkin on 8 October 1839 at Otisco, Onondaga Co, New York.⁹ Nathan Leverich was recorded in the 1840 U.S. Census of Otisco, Onondaga County, New York. The census tallies include 1 free white male age 10 to 14 (brother James S.); 2 free white males age 15 to 19 (brothers Edward E. and William H.); 1 free white male age 20 to 29 (head of household Nathan); 1 free white female age 20 to 29 (wife Bethia); 1 free white female age 50 to 59 (mother Mary).¹⁰

Bethia Wilkin Leverich died, probably from complications of child birth, on 5 June 1841 at Otisco, Onondaga Co, New York. An infant son died on 7 June 1841, age 13 days (hence born 12 May 1841). Both mother and son were buried at the Octagon School Cemetery in Onondaga County.¹¹

On 7 March 1842, Richard B. "Berrian" Leverich of Newtown Queens Co, New York sold to his brother Nathan Leverich of Otisco, Onondaga Co, New York, in consideration of \$100, a 1/9 share in the 97.5 acre farm of their late father's farm in Otisco. On 18 August 1842, Jesse Leverich of Clinton, Rock County, Wisconsin sold to his brother Nathan Leverich of Otisco, in consideration of \$110, a 1/9 share in the 97.5 acre farm of their late father's farm in Otisco. On 20 August 1842 Nathan sold the same tract back to his brother Jesse for the same amount of \$110.¹²

The newspaper *Albany Evening Journal* published the following legal notice on 29 July 1853. "MORTGAGE SALE. Whereas Elias Van Derlip of the city of Albany, on the 13th day of December 1850, did by indenture of mortgage for the purpose of securing the payment of \$1500, together with the interest thereon, payable semi-annually according to the conditions of a certain bond bearing even date therewith, executed by said Elias Van Derlip, convey to Nathan W. Leverich the following described property, to wit: all that certain house and lot of ground situate in the 8th ward of the city of Albany, on the west side of Ten Broeck St, being a part of lot number 1." The lot started at the northwest corner of Ten Broeck St and Patroon Street." Elias Van Derlip was the husband of Margaret Leverich, a first cousin once removed to Nathan W. Leverich. Margaret and Nathan shared Jesse Leverich as a grandfather.¹³

The said mortgage with the power of sale therein contained was recorded at the office of the Albany County Clerk on 14 November 1850 and was assigned to Eliezer Clark and Cornelius L. Alvord.¹⁴

N. W. Leverich is listed in the 1851 Canada Directory, identified as a lumber merchant living in Port Hope, Dunham County, Province of Ontario.¹⁵

On 14 October 1842, Mary Leverich of Otisco, Onondaga County, New York, widow of Richard B. Leverich Sr., sold two tracts of land to her son Nathan W. Leverich of Syracuse, Onondaga County. In consideration of \$1,200, the tracts included 58 acres in Lot 55 in Otisco, as well as 50 acres in Lot 56 in Lafayette, both townships located in Onondaga County. These two tracts appear to be the same as those Nathan purchased in 1838 from Eleazer Slocum. It would appear that sometime between 1838 and 1852 Mary Leverich came into possession of the tracts, then sold them back to Nathan. The deed was recorded 2 November 1854. However, a review of the deed indexes for Onondaga County does not reflect a transaction transferring the property to Mary.¹⁶

Nathan W. Leverich married Phoebe Turner before Nov 1852 at Onondaga County, New York.^{17,18} On 13 November 1852, Nathan W. Leverich and his wife Phebe Leverich, in consideration of \$1,200, sold land in Syracuse to William H. Alexander and Columbus C. Bradley. This is the earliest documented reference to Phoebe as the wife of Nathan. The lot of land is described as Lot 3 in Block 87, bordering Village lot 68 and a towpath. The deed was recorded 19 January 1853.¹⁹

The newspaper *The Buffalo Commercial*, published on 26 April 1853, includes a legal notice referencing a civil case in the Supreme Court of Monroe County, New York, i.e. Nathan W. Leverich, agent, plaintiff, against Lewis W. Walker, defendant. The case was filed on 28 March 1853 at the county clerk's office in Rochester. Nathan was represented by Daniel B. Beach, Attorney. The legal notice does not identify the specific nature of Nathan's complaint, but Nathan was seeking a judgement of \$105.²⁰

On 18 November 1853 Eliezer Clark and Cornelius L. Alvord sold to Nathan W. Leverich in consideration of \$400 the same lot at Albany, described as "all that certain house and lot of ground situate in the 8th ward of the city of Albany, on the west side of Ten Broeck St, being a part of lot number 1." The lot started at the northwest corner of Ten Broeck St and Patroon Street." The deed was recorded 25 November 1853. Another deed dated 6 June 1855 appears to record that Elias Van Derlip and his wife Margaret sold this same lot to Nathan Leverich in consideration of \$20. The two different sales to Nathan W. Leverich by different grantors is unexplained. Subsequently recorded on 23 October 1857, Nathan sold the property to his brother Edward E. Leverich.²¹

On 4 September 1855 Nathan W. Leverich and Phoebe Leverich his wife sold in consideration of \$2000 to Abraham Wilkins Jr the tract of land at Syracuse, Onondaga Co, New York, described as Lot 13 in Block 301, part of Lot 173 of the Onondaga Salt Springs Reservation, bordering the parallel streets Seymour and Gifford. In a deed on the same date Abraham Wilkins and his wife Lydia sold one half of this property back to Nathan and Phebe Leverich in consideration of \$1,000. These two deeds were both recorded on 26 September 1855. Subsequently on 29 July 1858, the same property was sold at auction to Phebe Leverich for \$2000 in satisfaction of an unpaid mortgage by Abraham Wilkins, Jr. The deed was recorded on 12 August 1858.²²

The 1856-1857 City Directory of Port Hope, Durham County, Ontario lists a N.W. (Nathan Woodhull) Leverich making his home at Elgin Street and James Leverich boarding at Elgin Street. James and N. W. were brothers. The 1857-1858 City Directory of Port Hope, Ontario lists N. W. Leverich a contractor, Elgin Street and a James S. Leverich, groceries and liquors at Walton Street.^{23,24}

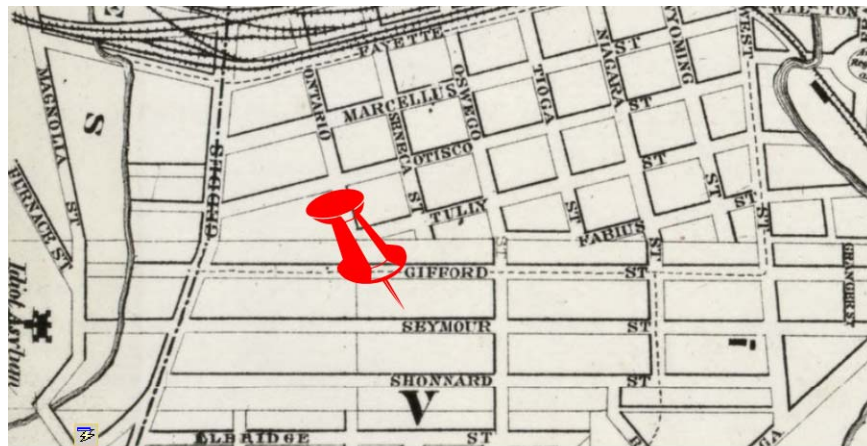
N. W. Leverich, age 45 born New York, flour dealer is recorded in the 1860 U.S. Census of Syracuse, Ward 5, Onondaga County, New York. The household also includes his wife Phebe, age 50 born Connecticut; and his mother Mary, age 71, born New York. In addition, there is Jane Shearer, age 16 born Canada, servant; and Eugene Spalding, age 18 born New York, relationship and occupation unknown.²⁵

The 1862 and 1864 Syracuse, New York City Directories list N.W. Leverich, flour and feed 99 East Genesee, home 153 Seymour Street.^{26,27}

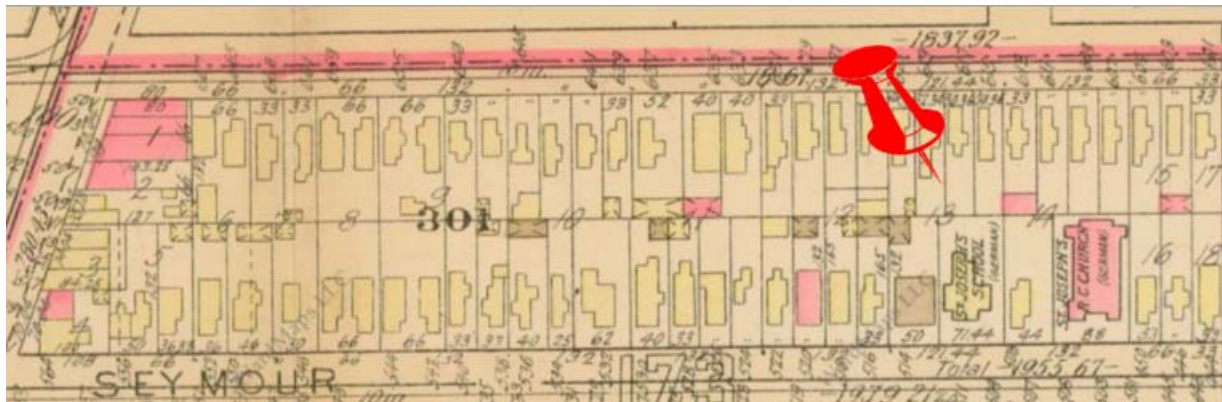
The 1864 U.S. IRS Tax Assessment List includes a listing for agent Nathan W. Leverich, Retail Dealer.²⁸

The 1865 New York State Census of Syracuse, Ward 5, records Nathan W. Leverich, age 53, born Kings Co (inaccurate, actually Queens Co), occupation not legible. The household includes wife Phoebe Leverich, age 60 born Connecticut, 2 children, number of times married not legible (likely 2 or 3, records support 2); nephew Levi Shepherd, age 16 born Connecticut, student.^{29,30}

On 16 April 1866 Nathan W. Leverich and his wife Phoebe of Syracuse, in consideration of \$4000 sold to Alfred N. Gilbert of Syracuse a tract described as part of lot 13, block 301, in Ward 5 of Syracuse located between Gifford and Seymour Street in Lot 173 of the Onondaga Salt Springs Reservation. The deed was recorded 17 April 1866. On 23 April 1866 Nathan and Phebe Leverich of Syracuse in consideration of \$1200 sold to William D. Chapin of Syracuse a part of a tract that was described in the same manner. This deed was recorded 24 April 1866. On 26 April 1866, Nathan and Phoebe sold another portion of Lot 13 Block 301 to Christian Halzman in consideration of \$1200. This deed was recorded 9 May 1866.³¹

On 2 July 1868 the newspaper *The Buffalo Commercial* reported that in the District Court for the Northern District of New York, a group of bankrupts set down for a final hearing on the 30 ult. were discharged. The list of individuals affected included Nathan W. Leverich.³²

Nathan W. Leverich, a flour and feed merchant, left his wife (Phoebe) in Lysander, Onondaga County, New York in 1869 and went east to travel for a cutlery company. He made a will in 1871, as did his wife. Circa 1873, having apparently abandoned his second wife Phoebe, Nathan married in Philadelphia a lady (name not identified) age 25. Although not true, Nathan apparently told this third partner that he had divorced his wife in Utah. These circumstances would eventually result in litigation over Nathan's estate after the died.^{33,34}

Nathan W. Leverich is not found in the 1870 U.S. Census or the 1875 New York State Census. The 1875 New York State Census does list Phoebe Leverich, age 71 born in Connecticut, boarding in the town of Schroepel, Oswego County, New York. Phoebe is boarding with Melissa Danforth.³⁵

Nathan W. Leverich died on 11 July 1878 at Williamsport, Lycoming County, Pennsylvania, at age 65. Nathan was a salesman for the Meriden cutlery company of Connecticut, the central office of which was at 49 Chambers St, Manhattan, New York County, New York. Nathan was a prominent commercial traveler, and he had been well known to hardware dealers and other merchants to whom he had been selling goods for about 12 to 15 years. He had arrived in Williamsport from New York suffering from cholera morbus, which he partially attributed to the drinking of ice water.^{36,37}

Nathan W. Leverich was buried at the Liverpool Cemetery plot 65 in Onondaga County, New York. Nathan's second wife Phoebe is buried in the same plot with her first husband and their children who died young.³⁸

Nathan W. Leverich, identified as age 58, made a will dated 29 May 1871, which named his wife Phoebe Leverich as his heir. Nathan and Phoebe did not have any children. The will was submitted for probate 12 November 1878 in the Onondaga County, New York Surrogate Court. As discussed above, the will was contested between Phoebe and an unidentified Philadelphia woman whom Nathan apparently "married" circa 1873. A record identifying the resolution of this matter has not been found.³⁹

Phoebe Leverich is recorded in the 1880 U.S. Census of Phoenix, Oswego County, New York. Phoebe is described as a boarder, nearly blind, age 76, born in Connecticut. She was boarding with Melissa Danforth.⁴⁰

Phoebe Leverich, age 78 of Lysander, Onondaga Co, New York made a will dated 10 May 1882. The will named the following heirs: nephew James W. Leverich, niece Martha Leverich, and niece Harriet Leverich all of Sparta, Madison County, Wisconsin; niece Sarah Shepherd of Danbury, Connecticut; sister Hannah Blackman and her three daughters of Hawleyville, Connecticut.⁴¹

Phoebe Leverich died 9 February 1886 at Phoenix, Oswego County, New York. Phoebe was buried at the Liverpool Cemetery Plot 65 in Onondaga County, New York. Her gravestone identifies her as Phoebe Turner, widow of John N. Smith, and also names two daughters who died young, i.e. Elizabeth Smith died 1830 and Susan Smith died 1824. Nathan Leverich appears to be buried in a separate grave but in the same plot.^{42,43}



A legal notice was published in the *Syracuse Standard* on 5 March 1886 announcing the date for a probate hearing for the will of Phoebe Leverich. The notice is addressed to the following known heirs and next of kin: William Turner of Dexter, Michigan; LeRoy Blackman and Mary Hollister of Danbury, Connecticut; Caroline Bristol of Hawleyville, Connecticut; Harriet Leverich of Sparta, Wisconsin; Jesse Turner of Stratford, Connecticut. Also named are all children of Jeremiah Turner deceased; and all children of Lydia H. Conklin deceased; Gain Bartlett deceased; Betsey T. Johnson deceased; and Polly T. Peck deceased whose names, ages and places of residence are wholly unknown.⁴⁴
