

Individual Narrative of Elizabeth⁸ Leverich [229]
Daughter of Richard⁷ Berrian Leverich and Mary Van Wickel
Wife of Francis Clark Spaulding and Henry Snyder

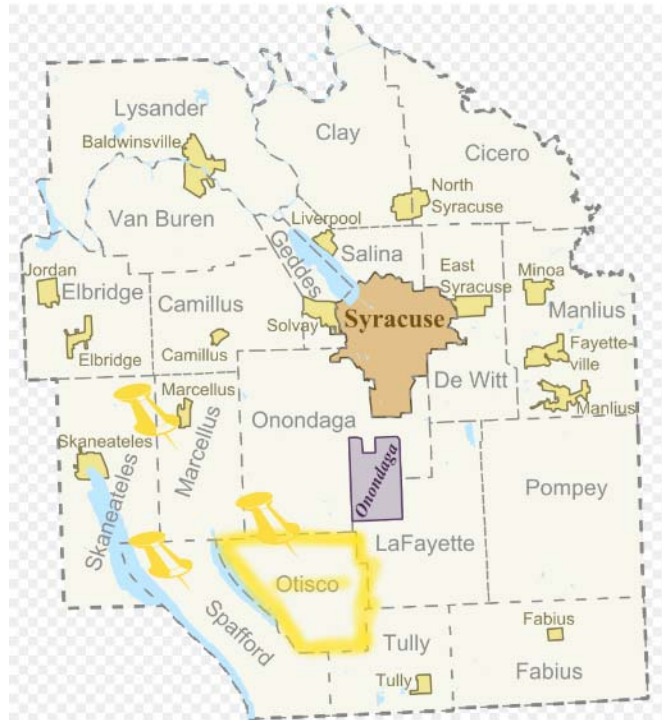
Elizabeth Leverich was born on 28 April 1820 at Onondaga Co, New York, the daughter of Richard Berrian Leverich and Mary Van Wickel. Circa 1817 Richard and Mary had relocated to Otisco, Onondaga Co from Newtown, Queens Co, New York.^{1,2,3}

Elizabeth married Francis Clark Spaulding on 1 July 1840 at Onondaga Co, New York. Francis was born 12 March 1818 in Northampton, Fulton County, New York, the son of David Spaulding and Lucy Carey.^{4,5,6} Francis C. Spaulding is recorded as a head of household in the 1840 U.S. Census of Otisco, Onondaga Co, New York. The census tallies list three white males age 15 to 19 and one free white female age 20 to 20 (presumably wife Elizabeth). The free white males are unidentified but one of them would presumably be Francis, although he was age 22 at the time.⁷



On 10 December 1847 David and Lucy Spaulding of Spafford Township, Onondaga County, New York leased land to Francis C. Spaulding of the Town of Otisco, in consideration of \$700 cash at the time of executing the lease, and annual payments of \$106. Francis was leasing a 190 acre farm, located in part of Lot 6 in the Town of Otisco, being the same place where Francis was then dwelling. The lease was effective for 18 years beginning the first of April the next year. The indenture was recorded 6 April 1848.⁸

Francis Spaulding farmer age 32 born New York is listed as the head of household in the 1850 U.S. Census of Spafford, Onondaga County, New York. The household also included wife Elizabeth age 30, born New York; son Eugene age 9; daughter Patience age 7; son Emmett age 5; daughter Harriett, age 3; and daughter Frances age 2. All of the children were born in New York.⁹

On 28 February 1852 F. Clark Spaulding and Elizabeth his wife of Spafford, Onondaga County sold land to Ansel Grinnell of Spafford in consideration of \$1100. The land was described as part of Lot 91, 40 acres in Spafford. The deed was recorded 23 July 1853.¹⁰ Also on 28 February 1852 C. F. Clark Spaulding and Elizabeth his wife sold land to David Spaulding in consideration of \$427. The land is described as the northern part of a farm 25 acres in part of Lot 91 in Spafford, Onondaga Co. The deed was recorded 1 October 1853.¹¹

Francis (recording error middle initial "B") Spaulding farmer age 37 (the place of birth was not legible) is recorded as the head of household in the 1855 New York State Census of Marcellus, Onondaga County, New York. The household also included wife Elizabeth age 35 born in Long Island; son Eugene age 13; daughter Patience age 11; son Emmet age 10; daughter Harriet age 9; daughter Frances age 7; and son Leeland age 1. The children are all listed as born in Onondaga County.¹²

On 1 April 1856 James Tolman Jr and his wife Rebecca D. of Marcellus, Onondaga County, sold land to F. C. Spaulding of Marcellus in consideration of \$2450. The land is described as 61 acres in Marcellus, part of lot 31, bordering the lands of Thomas Hutchinson and P. D. Howe. The deed was recorded 8 July 1856.¹³

Clark F. Spaulding farmer age 42 born in New York is listed as the head of household in the 1860 U.S. Census of Marcellus, Onondaga County, New York. The household also included wife Elizabeth age 40 born in New York; son Emmett age 15; daughter Harriet age 14; daughter Elizabeth age 12; and son Lee age 6. The children were all born in New York.¹⁴

On 3 June 1862 Francis Clark Spaulding and Elizabeth his wife of Marcellus, Onondaga County, sold land to Albert Curtis of Marcellus in consideration of \$3000. The land was described as 61 acres in Marcellus, part of lot 91 bordering the lands of Thomas Hutchinson and P. Dean Howe. The deed was recorded on 20 June 1862.¹⁵

The Spaulding family moved to Erie County, Ohio circa 1862. By 1867, the family had removed to McMinnville, Warren County, Tennessee where they remained until 1872.¹⁶

F. C. Spaulding farmer age 52 born New York is listed a head of household in the 1870 U.S. Census of District 1, McMinnville post office, Warren County, Tennessee. The household also included wife Elizabeth age 50 born New York; daughter Frances E. age 22 born New York; and son Lee age 16 born New York.¹⁷

In 1872 the Spaulding family arrived in Colorado Springs, El Paso County, Colorado where Francis was a member of the Fountain Colony which had chartered the city. Francis built the Spaulding House hotel the same year.¹⁸

On 8 July 1879, Francis Clark Spaulding and Elizabeth Leverich were divorced at Colorado Springs.¹⁹ Elizabeth Leverich and Francis Clark Spaulding had seven children, one of whom died as an infant. Two sons died as young adults in the Union Army during the Civil War.²⁰

- i. Eugene Spaulding was born 19 November 1841 in Otisco Township, Onondaga County, New York. Eugene never married. During the civil war, Eugene enlisted 10 August 1862 in Company F, 122nd New York Regiment. He participated in fifteen battles without significant injury, before being wounded at the Battle of the Wilderness in Spotsylvania County, Virginia. Eugene died of his injuries 17 June 1864 at Alexandria, Virginia. He was buried at the Alexandria National Cemetery.^{21,22,23}
- ii. Patience Elizabeth Spaulding was born 30 July 1843 in Otisco Township, Onondaga County, New York. Patience may have married for the first time circa 1860-1870 Franklin Bowker of Berlinville, Erie Co, Ohio. However, no marriage record has been found and no Bowker children have been identified. In the 1860 U.S. Census a Franklin Bowker is found as a miner in California Gulch, Arapahoe Co, Kansas Territory; and a Patience Spaulding is found in Marcellus, Onondaga Co, New York. In 1862, Patience's parents moved to Erie Co, Ohio and in 1867 they were located at Warren Co, Tennessee. Patience married Thomas J. Howard 25 June 1870 in Adams County, Illinois. The marriage record gives Patience's surname as "Spaulding", not "Bowker". Patience and Thomas had three Howard children. Patience died 12 May 1928 in Los Angeles, California. She was buried at the Fairview Cemetery, LaJunta, Otero County, California.^{24,25,26,27,27a}
- iii. Robert Emmet Spaulding was born 20 February 1845 in Otisco, Onondaga County, New York. Robert (aka Emmet) never married. During the civil war, Robert enlisted 11 January 1864 in Company E of the 4th Wisconsin Infantry/Calvary in Clinton, Rock County, Wisconsin. Robert died 5 May 1865 of disease contracted while in the union army while stationed in Baton Rouge, Louisiana. He was buried in the Baton Rouge National Cemetery.^{28,29,30,31,32}
- iv. Harriet (Hattie) Spaulding was born 21 January 1846 in Otisco, Onondaga County, New York. Hattie married first Albert A. Abbee 4 October 1866 in Erie County, Ohio. Hattie and Albert had no known children. Hattie married second John A. Himebaugh 21 July 1878 in El Paso, El Paso County, Colorado. Hattie died 6 December 1887 in Colorado Springs, El Paso County, Colorado. She was buried at the Evergreen Cemetery in Colorado Springs, El Paso County^{33,34,35,36,37,38,39}
- v. Frances Elizabeth Spaulding was born 16 July 1848 in Otisco, Onondaga County, New York. Frances married Delos Durfee 2 November 1873 Colorado Springs, El Paso County, Colorado. Frances died 27 January 1931 in Los Angeles, California. She was buried in the Evergreen Cemetery in Colorado Springs.^{40,41,42,43,44,45}
- vi. Garrison Spaulding was born 30 March 1850 and died as an infant 11 April 1850 in Spafford Township, Onondaga County, New York.⁴⁶
- vii. Leland David Spaulding was born 4 February 1854 in the town of Marcellus, Onondaga County, New York. Leland married Mary A. Nelson 3 December 1882 in Colorado Springs, El Paso County, Colorado. Leland died 29 June 1917 in Seattle, King County, Washington. Leland's remains were cremated.^{47,48,49,50,51,52}

On 15 December 1879 Francis Clark Spaulding remarried Naomi Berry, whose first marriage name was Huntress, at the city of Chelsea, Suffolk County, Massachusetts. The couple returned to Colorado Springs to live.^{53,54}

In the 1880 U.S. Census of Colorado Springs, El Paso County, Colorado F.C. Spaulding age 66 born New York and his second wife Naomi are recorded living in the household of Francis' and Elizabeth's daughter Hattie and her husband J.A. Himebaugh. Also living in the household is Mrs. Durfee age 32, i.e. Hattie's sister Frances Elizabeth.⁵⁵

Also recorded in the 1880 U.S. Census of El Paso is Mrs. E. L. Spaulding (aka Elizabeth Leverich), age 59 hotel keeper.⁵⁶ She married for the second time Henry Snyder on 14 December 1880 at Los Angeles, Los Angeles Co, California. They settled in Villa Park, Orange Co, California where Henry became an orange grower. Elizabeth and Henry did not have any children. Henry was born 5 April 1840 in Delaware County, Ohio the son of George Snyder and Sarah A. Sparks. Henry was a veteran of the Civil War, serving with the 13th Ohio Calvary.^{57,58,59,60}

Francis Clark Spaulding died 7 September 1886 in Colorado Springs, El Paso, Colorado. He was buried in Evergreen Cemetery in Colorado Springs.⁶¹

On 24 June 1893 the Los Angeles Times reported that "Mr. and Mrs. D. C. Pixley and two children left Tuesday for Ingham, Illinois. They were accompanied by Mrs. Henry Snyder of Villa Park, who goes East to visit friends, and Miss Inez Field, who goes to Colorado Springs, her home."⁶²

James S. Leverich died at Port Hope, Ontario, Canada on 10 October 1892. On 14 April 1894, Delia Leverich, widow of James, initiated litigation in the New York Supreme Court, Onondaga County, against the heirs of James S. Leverich, pertaining to the status of property in Onondaga County. The heirs listed included James' sister Elizabeth Snyder.⁶³

Elizabeth Snyder age 80 born New York is recorded in the 1900 U.S. Census of Orange, Orange County, California. Also listed is her husband Henry Snyder capitalist age 60 born in Ohio. A census taker recording error reported that Elizabeth's mother was born in the Bahama Islands. Actually, she was born in New York.⁶⁴

Elizabeth L. Snyder age 90 born New York is recorded in the 1910 U.S. Census of Orange, Orange Co, California. Also listed is her husband Henry Snyder mixed farming age 70 born in Ohio.⁶⁵

Elizabeth Leverich Spaulding Snyder died on 15 April 1911 at Villa Park, Orange, California, at age 90. A death notice was published in the Santa Ana Register stating that "the death of Mrs. Elizabeth Snyder wife of Henry Snyder, of Villa Park, occurred Saturday evening at her home. Mrs. Snyder was one of the pioneers of this vicinity, having resided here for over thirty years. She had reached her 91st year, and her advanced age was given as the cause of her death. Her health has been gradually failing of late years. -- Orange News.^{66,67}"

The Santa Ana Register reported on 10 June 1911 that "a will that is so old that the witnesses cannot remember signing it may never be admitted to probate in the superior court. The will is that of Elizabeth Snyder, who died at Orange on April 15, 1911. The will was in the possession of her son, L.D. Spaulding of Los Angeles and was presented for probate by him. Under the will the estate goes in thirds to three children, the unusual feature being that the one third of a daughter, Frances E. Durfee of Orange, is to be held by Spaulding, the interest to be paid to her and the principal held until such time as Spaulding sees fit to give it to her. The will bears the date of 12 April 1892 and a codicil is dated 1 August 1899."

"D. C. Pixley and his son, W. C., both of Orange, appear as witnesses to both the will and the codicil. Both recognized their signatures. W. C. Pixley remembers nothing of having signed in 1892, at which time he was but 12 years of age and at that age not likely to be called as a witness. He remembers being called by W. H. H. Clayton, a notary, to sign some paper, but he could not recognize Mrs. Snyder's signature. D.C. Pixley identified his signatures but could not place the occasion of the signing. W. H. H. Clayton was called, but he could not remember having had anything to do with drawing up the will. L.D. Spaulding recognized the signature as that of his mother's. Judge West said that the showing was not sufficient, but that he would admit the will to probate if Mrs. Durfee would sign a stipulation allowing it to be admitted.⁶⁸"

Henry Snyder died at Los Angeles on 10 January 1937. He was buried at the Angelus Rosedale Cemetery in Los Angeles. Henry was a benefactor of Pomona College, providing an endowment for the sociology department and annual scholarships.⁶⁹

There is no evidence to support these assertions. A different individual named Robert Emmet enlisted in the 4th Wisconsin Cavalry 1 December 1863 and was mustered out 28 May 1866.
