

Individual Narrative of John⁸ A. Cameron Leverich [262] Son of James⁷ Leverich [131] and Mary Moore Cameron

John A. Cameron Leverich was born after 1830 in Brooklyn, Kings Co, New York. He was the son of James Leverich and Mary M. Cameron. The 1830 U.S. Census for James Leverich records two non-adult males, which presumably would be John's brothers William H. C. Leverich (born 1825) and James O.W. Leverich (born 1829) (the age tallies in this census record are incorrect). The 1840 U.S. Census for Mary Leverich (James Leverich had died in 1839) records three non-adult males, presumably brothers William, James, and Augustus. Augustus was born in 1830. Therefore, it is likely that John A. Cameron Leverich died as a child before 1840. He was buried at Greenwood Cemetery Brooklyn, Kings Co, New York 11 June 1853, presumably removed from his original burial place, probably in Augusta, Richmond Co, Georgia where the family was living in 1830 and 1840.^{1,2,3}
