Individual Narrative of Sarah⁸ Ann Leverich [295] Daughter of James⁷ Hervey Leverich [138] and Sarah Ann Webb

Sarah Ann Leverich was born on 11 March 1841 at New Orleans, Orleans Parish, Louisiana.¹

Sarah A. Leverich, age 9, was recorded in the 1850 U.S. Census of Manhattan, Ward 18, New York County, New York. Her household included her widowed mother Sarah Ann Leverich, age 47; also siblings William H., age 22; Jasper, age 15; James, age 6; Ann M., age 12, and Eliza J., age 9.²

Sarah A. Leverich joined the Fifth Avenue Presbyterian Church in Manhattan, New York County, New York on 9 May 1858 and was confirmed. She had been baptized 7 May 1858.³

Sarah A. Leverich, age 29, was recorded in the 1860 U.S. Census of Manhattan, Ward 18, New York County, New York. Her household included her mother Sarah, age 52; also her siblings Jasper, age 25; Anna, age 21, and Eliza, age 20.⁴



Sarah A. Leverich married George P. Wright on 23 April 1868 at the Newtown Presbyterian Church, Queens County, New York.⁵

On 27 September 1869 the Fifth Avenue Presbyterian Church in Manhattan discharged Sarah A. Leverich Cox to the Newtown Presbyterian Church.⁶

George P. Wright was born circa 1838 at Newtown, Queens County, New York. George's parents have not been identified.⁷

Sarah A. Wright, age 29, was recorded in the 1870 U.S. Census of Newtown, Queens County, New York. Her household included her husband George P. Wright, age 32, a medical doctor; also her mother Sarah, age 53 as well as her sisters Anna M. Leverich, age 31; and Eliza J. Leverich, age 30.⁸

George P. Wright died 22 September 1876 at Newtown, Queens County, New York. His place of burial has not been identified.⁹

Sarah A. Leverich and George P. Wright had no children.

Sarah A. Leverich, widow of George P. Wright, married for a second time Rev. Samuel Cox, in Manhattan, New York County, New York. It was a second marriage for both parties. Samuel Cox was the Rector of the St. James Episcopal Church in Newtown, Queens County, New York.^{10,11}

Rev. Doctor Samuel Cox was born 3 October 1815 in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. He was the son of Samuel Cox, Sr. and Helen Maria Lyman. He married for the first time circa 1850 Caroline Mary Bulkeley. Caroline died in 1872. Samuel had three children by his first marriage: Helen Maria (Nellie) Cox, Louise Bulkeley Cox, and Anna Sitgreaves Cox. The source of some of the above information was the "Scott/Fike/DeWitte/Edwards" family tree at Ancestry.com owned by Sharon Hammond of Prescott, Arizona.¹²

Sarah A. Cox, age 39, was recorded in the 1880 U.S. Census of Newtown, Queens County, New York. Her household included her husband Samuel Cox, age 55; her father-in-law Samuel Cox Sr, age 82; and her step-daughters Helen Cox, age 29; and Anna S. Cox, age 22.¹³

On 24 October 1888 Samuel Cox made application for a passport in Queens County, New York. He mentions his sisterin-law Eliza J. Leverich and his niece Daisey Leverich, but not his wife by name.¹⁴

Sarah A. Cox, age 70, was recorded in the 1900 U.S. Census of Hempstead, Nassau County, New York. Her household included her husband Samuel Cox, age 74; her sister Eliza J. Leverich, age 50; and her niece Daisey Leverich, age 24.¹⁵ Sarah A. Leverich Cox died 4 March 1903 at the deanery of the Episcopal Cathedral in Garden City, Nassau County, New York where her husband the Rev. Samuel Cox was Dean of the Cathedral. She was buried in All Saints Cemetery in Great Neck, Nassau County, New York.^{16,17}

Rev. Samuel Cox died 21 July 1903 at Garden City, Nassau Co, New York. He was buried at All Saints Cemetery in Great Neck, Nassau County.^{18,19}

Sarah A. Leverich Cox and Samuel Cox had no children.
