## Individual Narrative of Margaret<sup>8</sup> Douglas Gorsline [316] Daughter of Sarah<sup>7</sup> Leverich [145] and Peter Gorsline Jr.

Margaret Douglas Gorsline was born on 9 December 1855 at Newtown, Queens County, New York.<sup>1</sup> Margaret was baptized 28 September 1856 at the Newtown Presbyterian Church.<sup>2</sup>

Margaret D. Gorsline, age 4, was recorded in the 1860 U.S. Census of Flushing, Queens County, New York. Margaret's household included her parents Peter and Sarah Gorsline, ages 27 and 26 respectively, and her sister Anna L. Gorsline, age 6. Also included was her aunt Anna Leverich, age 30.<sup>3</sup>

At some point during the family's tenure in Queens County, Margaret D. Gorsline's family lived in a house located at Shell Road and Junction Avenue.<sup>4</sup>

Margaret D. Gorsline, age 14. was recorded in the 1870 U.S. Census of Elizabeth Ward 5, Union County, New Jersey. Her household included her parents Peter and Sarah Gorsline, ages 34 and 30 respectively and her sister Anna L. Gorsline, age 16.<sup>5</sup>

By 1879 Margaret's family may have returned to Queens County, New York. The 1878-1879 Long Island Directory lists a Peter Gorsline living at Amity Street in Flushing. Neither Margaret D. Gorsline nor her father Peter Gorsline are found in the 1880 U.S. Census of Queens County or Union County, New Jersey, or anywhere else in the 1880 census.<sup>6,7</sup>

By 1891, Margaret D. Gorsline and her sister Anna L. Gorsline had opened a retail shop selling "fine goods and notions". See advertisement below. The sisters would maintain this business for over twenty years later relocating on Park Avenue near Second street. They sold the shop toa Mrs. Irving Bisinger circa 1913-1914.<sup>8,9</sup>



Margaret Gorsline and her sister Anna L. Gorsline were boarders at 510 Madison Avenue in the 1900 U.S. Census of Plainfield Ward 3, Union County, New Jersey. Both were listed as "Dealer in Notions.<sup>10</sup>

Margaret Gorsline and her sister Anna L. Gorsline are renters at 122 Madison Avenue in the 1910 U.S. Census of Plainfield Ward 4, Union County, New York. They are both associated with "Fancy Store". Anna is identified as "employer". Margaret is identified as "wage earning sales lady.<sup>11</sup>

Anna L. Gorsline died 9 March 1914 at Plainfield, Union County, New Jersey.<sup>12,13</sup>

Margaret D. Gorsline, age 64, was recorded living at 331 East South Street in the 1920 U.S. Census of Plainfield, Union County, New Jersey. She is living alone except for one lodger Adeline Robinson, a minister.<sup>14</sup>

Margaret D. Gorsline, age 74, was recorded living at 313 Franklyn Place in the 1930 U. S. Census of Plainfield, Union County, New Jersey. She was an inmate in what appears to be a nursing home.<sup>15</sup>

Margaret Douglas Gorsline died on 28 Jan 1940 at Plainfield, Union County, New Jersey, at age 84.<sup>16</sup> Margaret D. Gorsline was never married. She died at the Catherine Webster Home, 313 Franklyn Place. Funeral services were held at the Crescent Avenue Presbyterian Church. She was buried at the Hillside Cemetery in Scotch Plains, Union County, New Jersey.<sup>17,18</sup>
