

**Individual Narrative of Sarah⁸ Berrian Leverich [336]
Daughter of Richard⁷ Berrian Leverich [179] and Alletta Vandervoort**

Sarah Berrian Leverich was born on 22 June 1800 at Newtown, Queens County, New York.¹ Sarah B. Leverich was baptized 23 July 1800 at the Newtown Presbyterian Church.²

Sarah B. Leverich was not found in the 1850 or 1860 U. S. Census.

Sarah B. Leverich, age 70, was recorded in the 1870 U. S. Census of Manhattan Ward 22 District 1, New York County, New York. Sarah was living in the household of her sister Lotta Smith (i.e. Aletta Leverich), age 63.³

Sarah B. Leverich, age 79, was recorded in the 1880 U. S. Census of Brooklyn, Kings County, New York residing at 107 Sixth Avenue. Sarah was living in the household of her sister Aletta (Leverich) Smith, age 45.⁴

Sarah B. Leverich was never married (see census records above).

Sarah Berrian Leverich died on 28 August 1881 at Brooklyn, Kings County, New York, at age 81.⁵ She was buried at the Beechwoods Cemetery in New Rochelle, Westchester County, New York.⁶
