Individual Narrative of Mary⁸ Ann Leveridge [406] Daughter of Benjamin⁷ Chase Leveridge [206] and Mary Ann Van Pelt

Mary Ann Leveridge was born either March 1837 (1900 Census) or 8 March 1838 (New York, NY City Municipal Deaths) in Manhattan, New York County, New York.^{1,2}

Mary Ann Leveridge was never married.^{3,4}

Mary Ann Leveridge, age 12, was recorded in the 1850 U. S. Census of Manhattan Ward 7 District 1, New York County, New York. Mary Ann was living with her parents and siblings.⁵

Mary A. Leveridge was a student at the Rutgers Female Institute in Manhattan, New York County, New York. Mary was listed in the Catalogue of Young Ladies connected with Rutgers Female Institute during the sixteenth academic year 1855; First Department, Miss Jane R. Buckley, teacher.⁶

Mary Leveridge, age 20, was recorded in the 1860 U. S. Census of Manhattan Ward 7 District 2, New York County, New York. Mary Ann was living with her parents and siblings.⁷

Mary A. Leveridge, age 31, was recorded in the 1870 U. S. Census of Manhattan Ward 7 District 6, New York County, New York. Mary Ann was living with her parents and siblings. No occupation was listed for Mary Ann.⁸

Mary A. Leveridge, age 42, was recorded in the 1880 U. S. Census of Manhattan, New York County, New York. Mary Ann was living with her brother John H. Leveridge and John's daughter Emily P. Leveridge. Mary Ann's occupation is given as "at home."⁹

Mary A. Leveridge, age 50, was recorded in the 1892 New York State Census of Brooklyn Ward 19, Kings County, New York. Mary Ann was living with her niece Emily P. MacKenzie and Emily's husband Robert MacKenzie. No occupation was listed for Mary Ann.¹⁰

Mary A. Leverich, age 63, was recorded in the 1900 U. S. Census of Brooklyn Ward 23, Kings County, New York living at 546 Putnam Avenue. Mary Ann was living with her niece Emily P. MacKenzie and Emily's husband Robert MacKenzie. No occupation was listed for Mary Ann.¹¹

Mary A. Leverich, age 67, was recorded in the 1905 New York State Census of Brooklyn, Kings County, New York living at 546 Putnam Avenue. Mary Ann was living with her niece Emily P. MacKenzie and Emily's husband Robert MacKenzie.¹²

Mary A. Leverich, age 70, was recorded in the 1910 U. S. Census of Brooklyn Ward 23, Kings County, New York living at 546 Putnam Avenue. Mary Ann was living with her niece Emily P. MacKenzie and Emily's husband Robert MacKenzie.¹³

Mary Ann Leveridge died on 7 April 1918 at Brooklyn, Kings, New York, at age 80. Mary Ann was buried at Greenwood Cemetery in Brooklyn, Kings County, New York^{14,15,16}

Mary A. Leveridge made a will 7 August 1908 which was proved at the Kings County, New York Surrogate Court on 27 May 1918. Mary Ann left her entire estate to her brother Charles W. Leveridge. The probate proceedings mention the following individuals:
