

Individual Narrative of Patience⁶ Leverich [58] First Wife of Henry Stanton

Patience Leverich^{1,2,3} was born on 2 Dec 1757 at Newtown, Queens, New York, the daughter of William Leverich and Dorothy Morse.⁴

Patience Leverich married Henry Stanton on 15 May 1782 at Newtown, Queens Co, New York.⁵

Patience Leverich Stanton died on 10 Aug 1785 at New York at age 27. She was buried at the Leverich Family Burial Ground in Queens County, New York.⁶ Patience Leverich and Henry Stanton apparently had no children. They had been married only three years at the time of Patience's death.⁷

Henry Stanton was born 12 September 1761, the son of George Stanton and Agnes Blanck of New York City.^{8,9}

Henry Stanton married for a second time on 19 April 1786 to Maria Wynkoop at Trinity Church Parish in New York City.¹⁰

Maria was daughter of Captain Cornelius Wynkoop and Maria Catherine Ruhl.^{11,12} Maria Wynkoop was born 1 July 1762 and died 14 July 1828 at New York City.¹³

On 14 March 1787, the following advertisement was published in the *New York Daily Advertiser*:

"Henry Stanton begs leave to inform his friends and the public in general, that he has provided for the convenience of families, or parties of pleasure, for the ensuing season, a light covered wagon, hung upon steel springs, equal ... to any coach. He has also to lett, good horses and chairs, and genteel saddle horses. Those gentlemen who please to employ either of the above, may depend on being served by leaving a line one day beforehand with Mr. Cannon at the Ferry. N.B. He also begs leave to inform the public that he carries on the Coach and Chair making business in all its various branches, iin the best and cheapest manner. He returns sincere thanks to his friends and customers for their former favor and hopes they will continue. HENRY STANTON, Brooklyn-Ferry, March 13, 1787.¹⁴"

Henry Stanton, formerly of Brooklyn, New York died on 21 October 1830 at New Rochelle, Westchester County, New York.¹⁵

Henry Stanton and Maria Wynkoop had six children.

- i. George Henry Stanton, born 6 January 1787, married Sophia Avery, and died 25 April 1851.
- ii. Richard Stanton, born 20 January 1789, married Elizabeth Waterbury, and died 19 September 1864.
- iii. Cornelius Wynkoop Stanton, born 10 June 1791, married Mary Stewart, and died 10 January 1827.
- iv. Mary Catherine Stanton, born June 1794, married first George Everit and then James Titus, and died in 1887.
- v. Agnes Stanton was born 7 August 1797, and died unmarried.
- vi. Augustus Stanton was born 23 January 1803, and died unmarried 28 June 1828.^{16,17}
